There are a total number of Forty thousand, Three hundred and Seventy (**40,370**) Senior Secondary Schools nationwide as at May 2024. They include Eleven Thousand, Three Hundred and Ninety-nine (**11,399**) Public schools, Twenty-eight Thousand, Five Hundred and Three (**28,503**) Private Schools, Three Hundred and Seventy-seven (**377**) Technical and Vocational Schools and Ninety-one (**91**) Special needs schools as shown in table 1.

Figure 1: Types and Percentage of Senior Secondary Schools in Nigeria.

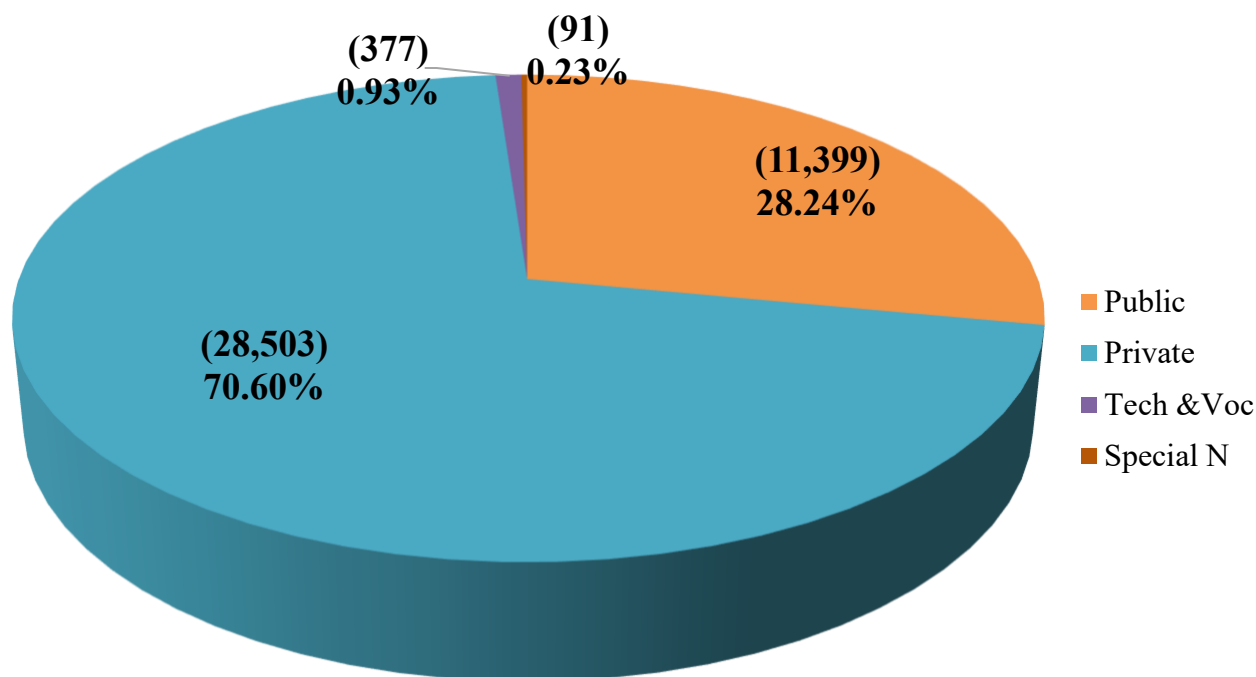
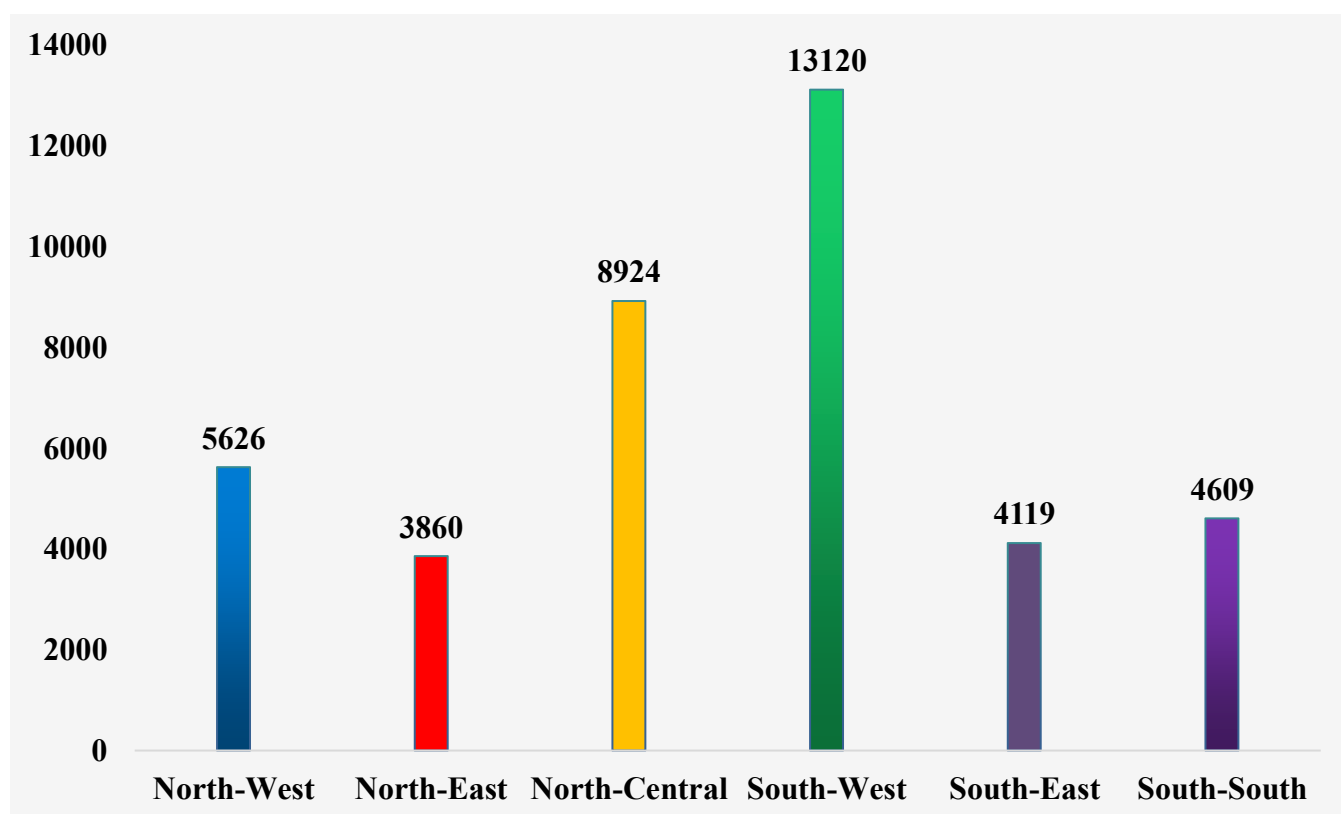


Figure 1 shows the types and percentage of Senior Secondary Schools available in Nigeria. **28.24%** of Senior Secondary Schools in Nigeria are Public Schools, **70.60%** are Private Schools, **0.93%** are Technical and Vocational Schools, while **0.23%** are Special Needs Schools. This indicates that the Private Schools have the highest percentage of Senior Secondary Schools nationwide. In 2021, the percentage was at **59.17%** showing that there is an increase in the number of private senior secondary schools in Nigeria. The chart also shows that **there is a shortage in the number of Technical and Vocational schools as well as Special Needs Schools nationwide.**

The number of Senior Secondary Schools in the six Geo-political zones is shown in figure 2. There are Five Thousand, Six Hundred and Twenty-six (**5,626**) Schools in the North-West, Three Thousand, Eight Hundred and Sixty (**3,860**) Schools in the North-East, Eight Thousand, Nine Hundred and Twenty-four (**8,924**) Schools in the North-Central, Thirteen Thousand, One Hundred and Twenty (**13,120**) Schools in the South-West, Four Thousand, One Hundred and Nineteen (**4,119**) Schools in the South-East and Four Thousand, Six Hundred and Nine (**4,609**) Schools in the South-South zones. This shows that South-West zone has the highest number (**13,120**) of Senior Secondary Schools while North-East has the least number (**3,860**) of Senior Secondary Schools nationwide. However, while all zone had slight increase in the total number of schools in their zones, a decrease is observed in the total number of schools in the North-west zone when compared with the data for 2021/2022.

The total number of learners in the Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 states and FCT is shown in tables 2 and 3. There are Four Million, Nine Hundred and Twenty-nine Thousand, Nine Hundred and Sixty (**4,929,960**) learners with Two Million, Five Hundred and Seven Thousand, Five Hundred and Ninety-six (**2,507,596**) male and Two Million, Four Hundred and Twenty-two Thousand, Three Hundred and Sixty-four (**2,422,364**) female learners respectively.

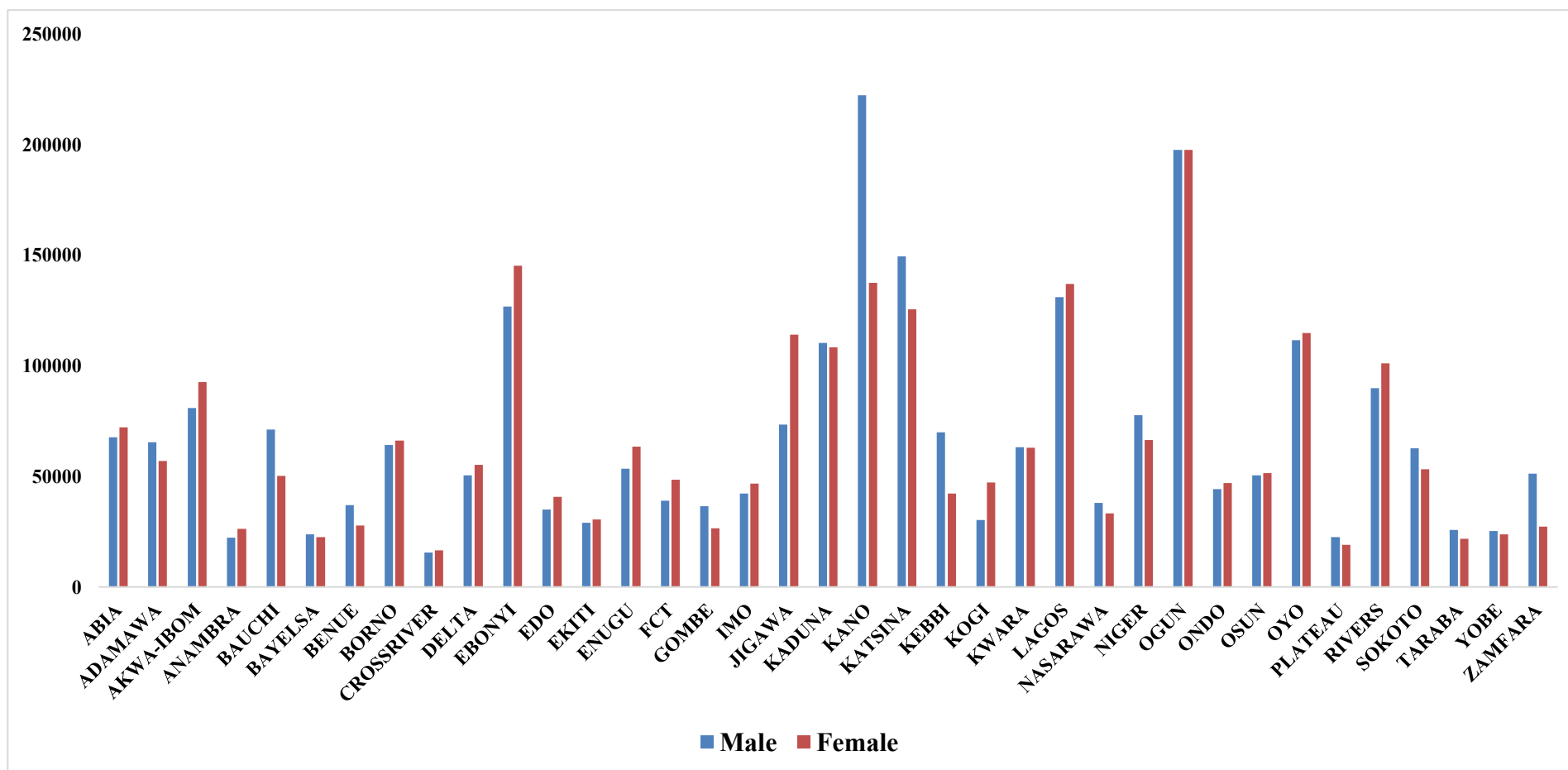


Figure 4: Enrolment of Learners in Senior Secondary Schools by Gender Nationwide.

Figure 3 below shows the enrolment of senior secondary school learners by state by Gender. It indicates that Kano state has highest number of male learners with Two Hundred and Twenty-two Thousand, Three Hundred and Thirty-six (**222,336**) learners while Cross River State has the lowest number of male learners with Fifteen Thousand, Six Hundred and Sixty-six (**15,666**) learners. Ogun state has the highest number of female learners with One Hundred and Ninety-eight Thousand, Six Hundred and Fifty-six (**198,656**) learners while Cross River State has the lowest number of female learners with Sixteen Thousand, Four Hundred and Fifty-seven (**16,457**) learners. Figure 4 also shows that female enrolment is higher than the male enrolment in Abia, Akwa-Ibom, Anambra, Borno, Delta, Ebonyi, Edo, Enugu, Ekiti, Imo, Jigawa, Kogi, Lagos, Ondo, Osun, Oyo and Rivers States while the male enrolment is higher than the female enrolment in Adamawa, Bauchi, Bayelsa, Benue, Gombe, Kaduna, Kano, Katsina, Kebbi, Kwara, Nasarawa, Niger, Plateau, Sokoto, Taraba and Zamfara States.

Figure 3: Enrolment of Senior Secondary School Learners by State by Gender

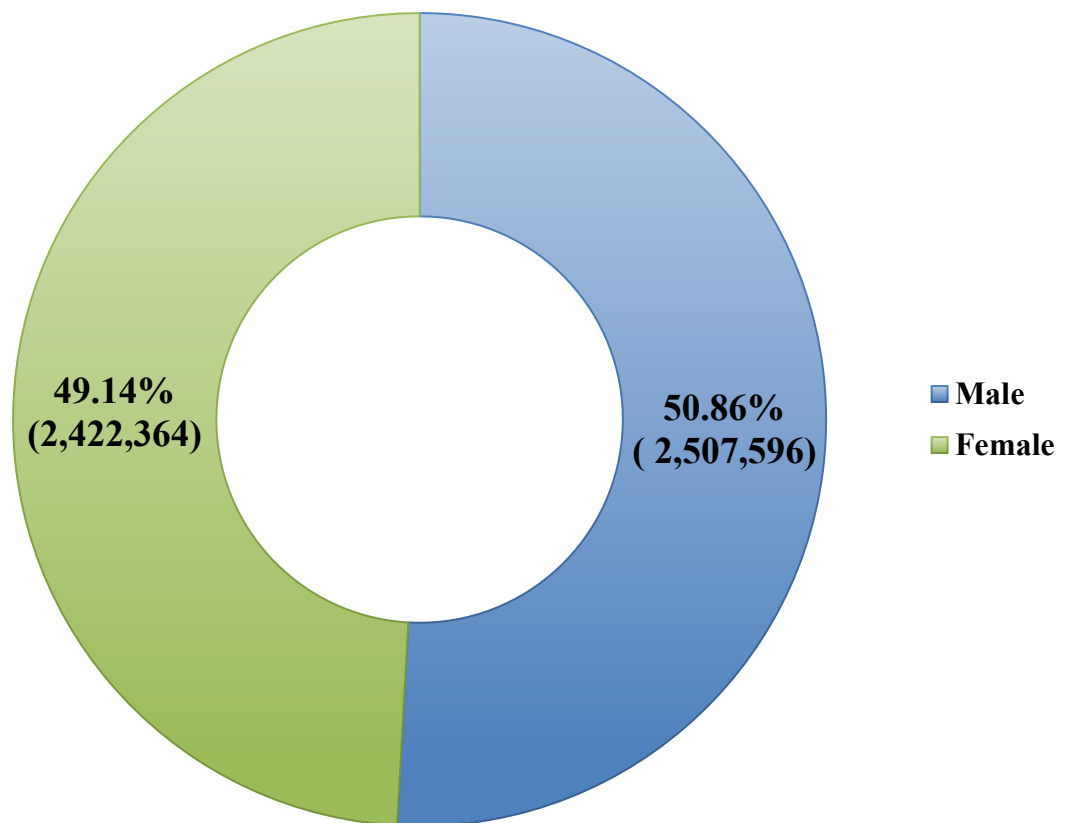
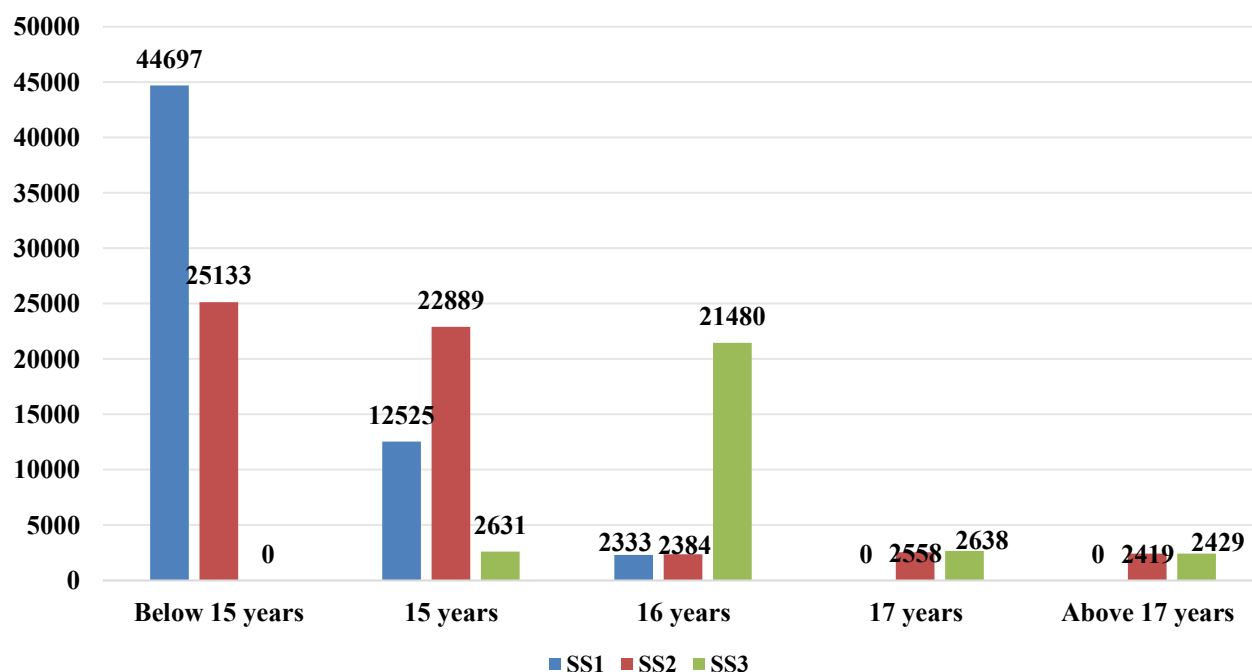


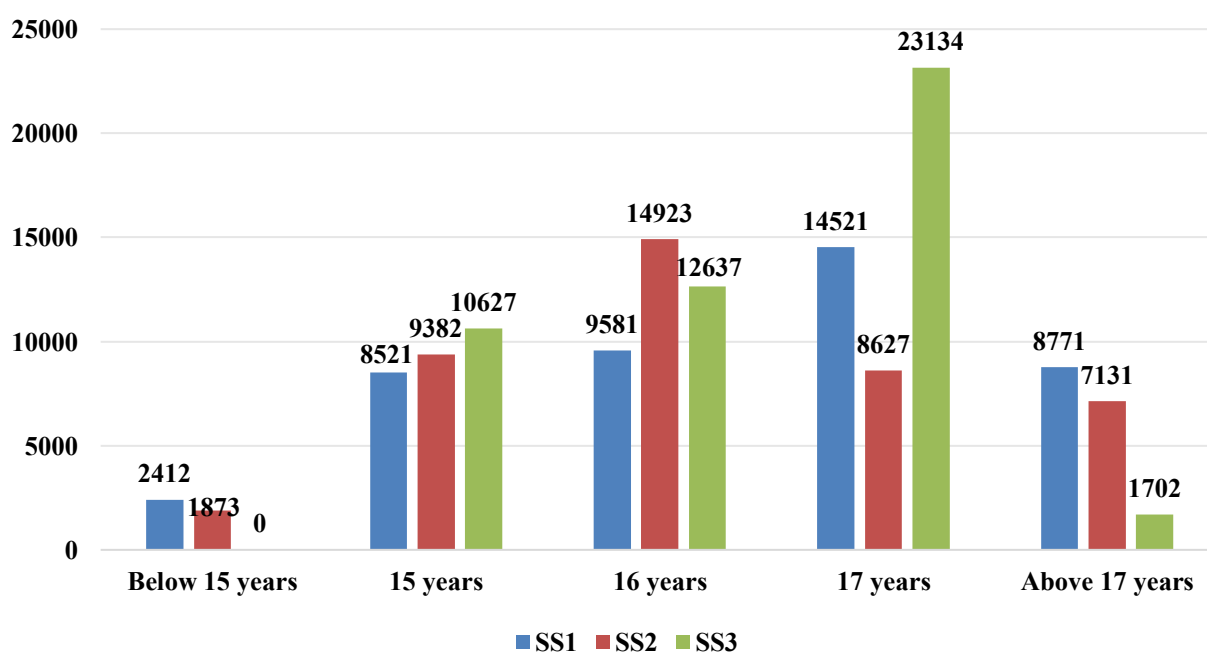

Figure 5: Age of Senior Secondary School Learners by Class by States

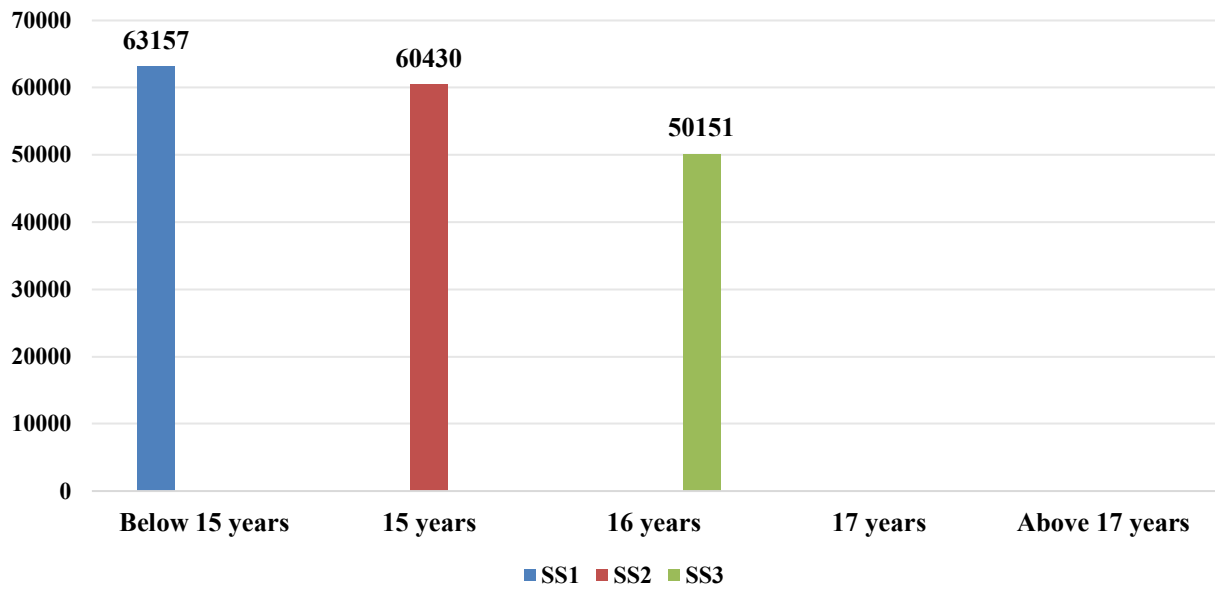

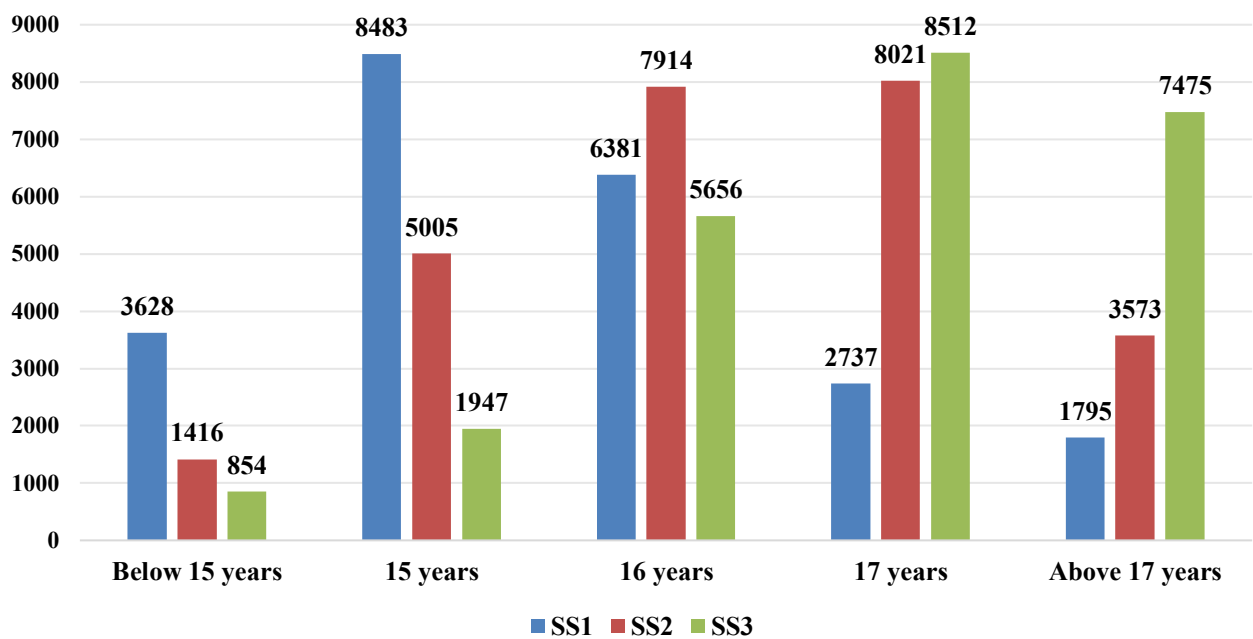


Figure 6 : Total Age of Senior Secondary School Learners Nationwide.

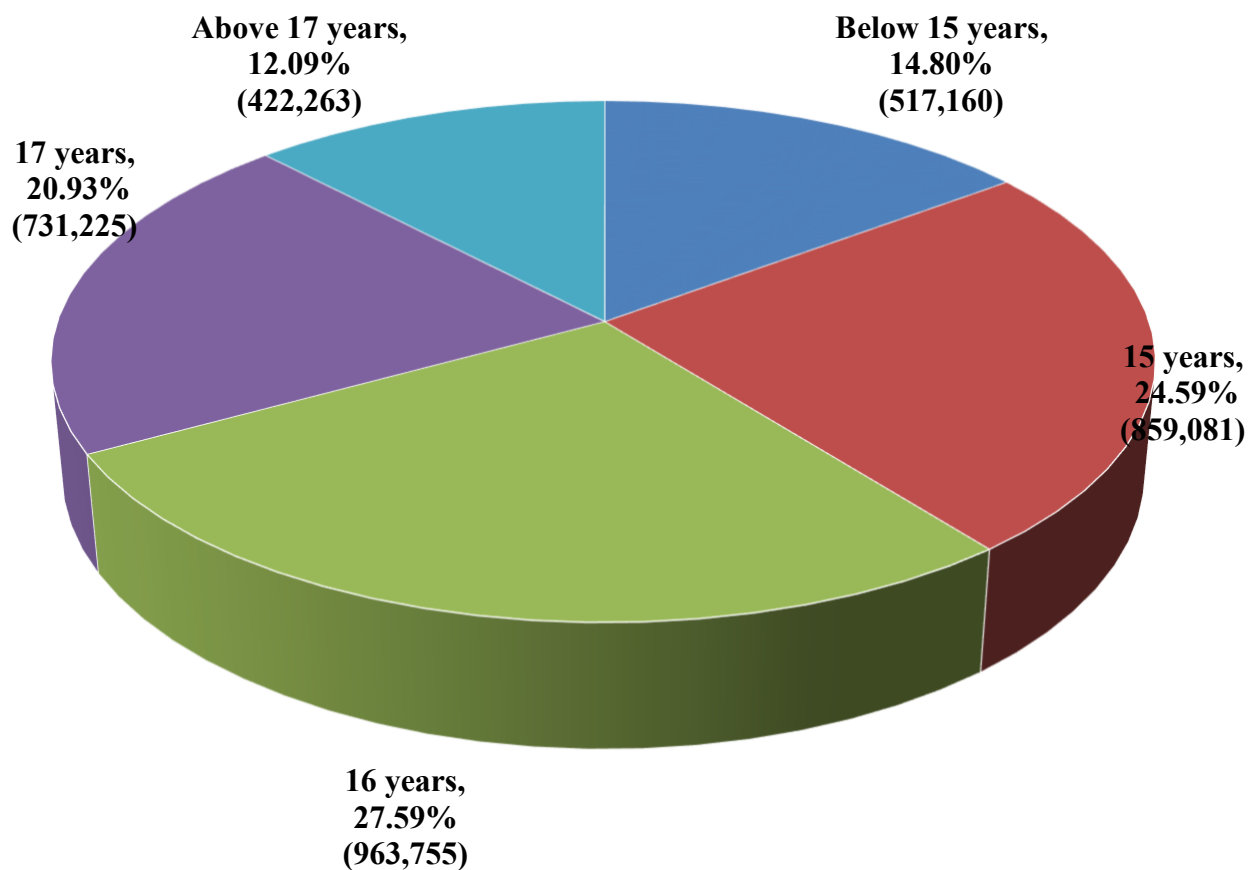


Figure 5 shows the Age of Senior Secondary School Learners by Class and by States. The charts from the various states reveals that most learners in SS1 class fall mostly below 15 years and 15 years of age. However, some learners in this class fall slightly in the other age groups. Learners in SS2 fall mostly at 16 years of age while learners in SS3 fall mostly within 17 years and above 17 years of age.

Figure 6 shows the total age of senior secondary school learners nationwide. 27.59% (963,755) of senior secondary school learners are 16 years of age, 24.59% (859,081) are 15 years of age, 20.93% (731,225) are 17 years of age, 14.80% (517,160) are below 15 years of age and 12.09% (422,263) are above 17 years of age. The chart reveals that majority of senior secondary school learners fall within the ages of 15 - 17 years of age.

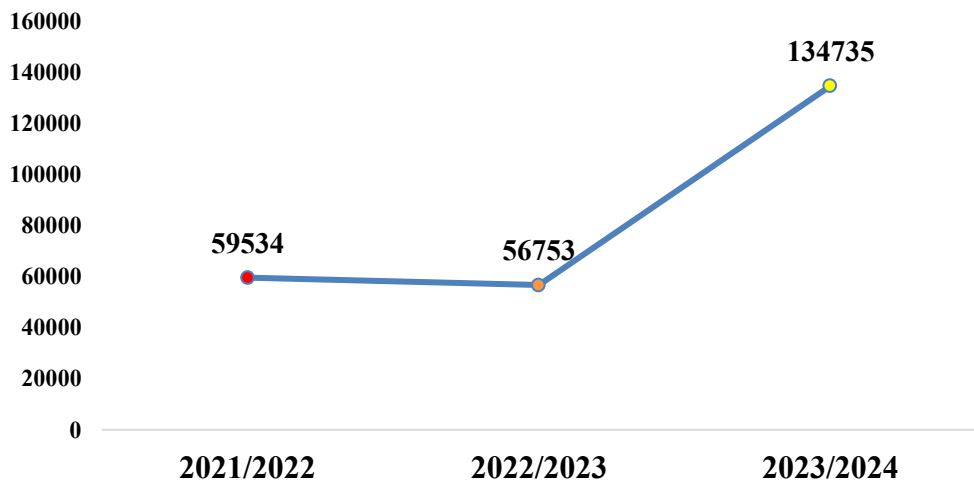
Figure 7: Enrolment of Learners in the Senior Secondary Schools from 2021-2024



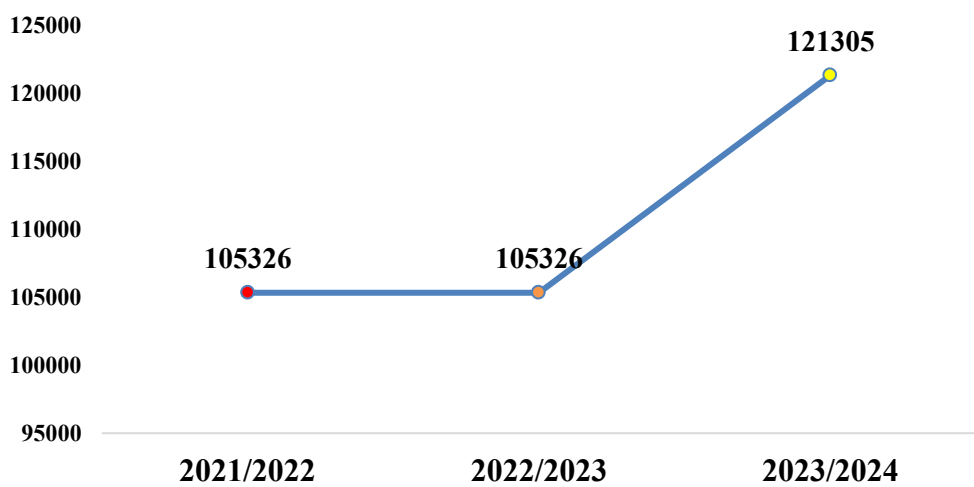

Figure 7 shows the enrolment of learners in the senior secondary schools from 2021- 2024. The following states revealed a steady increase in the enrolment of learners from 2021/2022, 2022/2023, 2023/2024; Abia, Adamawa, Akwa-Ibom, Anambra, Bauchi, Bayelsa, Borno, Ebonyi, Ekiti, Kaduna, Katsina, Sokoto, Yobe, Zamfara State. Benue, FCT, Kebbi, Kwara and Lagos State revealed an increase followed by a decrease in enrolment. A steady decrease in the enrolment of learners was observed in Cross river, Delta, Kebbi, Nasarawa, Ogun, Osun, Oyo, Plateau, Rivers and Taraba State. A decrease followed by an increase in enrolment of learners was observed in Edo, Enugu, Gombe, Imo, Jigawa, Kano, Kogi, Niger and Ondo State.

Figure 8: Percentage of Learners and Drop-outs in Senior Secondary Schools Nationwide

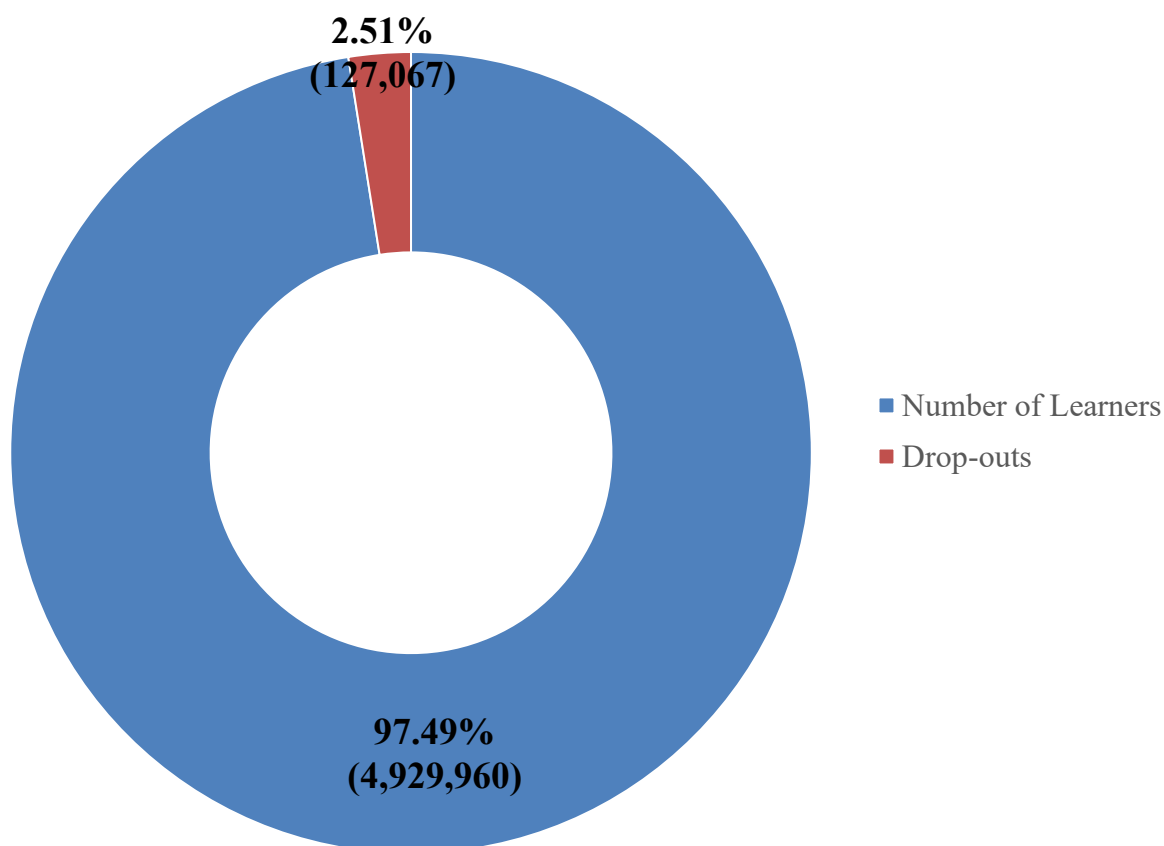


Table 8 shows the total number of senior secondary school drop-outs by state, class and gender. It revealed that Abia State (**36,700**) has the highest number of drop-outs followed by Kano State (**30,863**) and Ebonyi State (**13,228**). Some States did not record any drop-out and they include; Adamawa, Akwa-Ibom, Bayelsa, Borno, Cross River, Delta, Edo, Enugu, FCT, Imo, Jigawa, Kebbi, Lagos and Ogun.

Figure 6 shows the percentage of learners and drop-outs in senior secondary schools nationwide. The chart showed that **2.51% (127,067)** of learners dropped out of the senior secondary school nationwide in the 2023/2024 session with **56.43% (71,701)** male and **43.57% (55,366)** female drop-outs.

Table 5 shows the total number of learners with disabilities by state, class and gender. Figure 9: Total Number of Senior Secondary Schools with Entrepreneurship Option in the 36 States and FCT

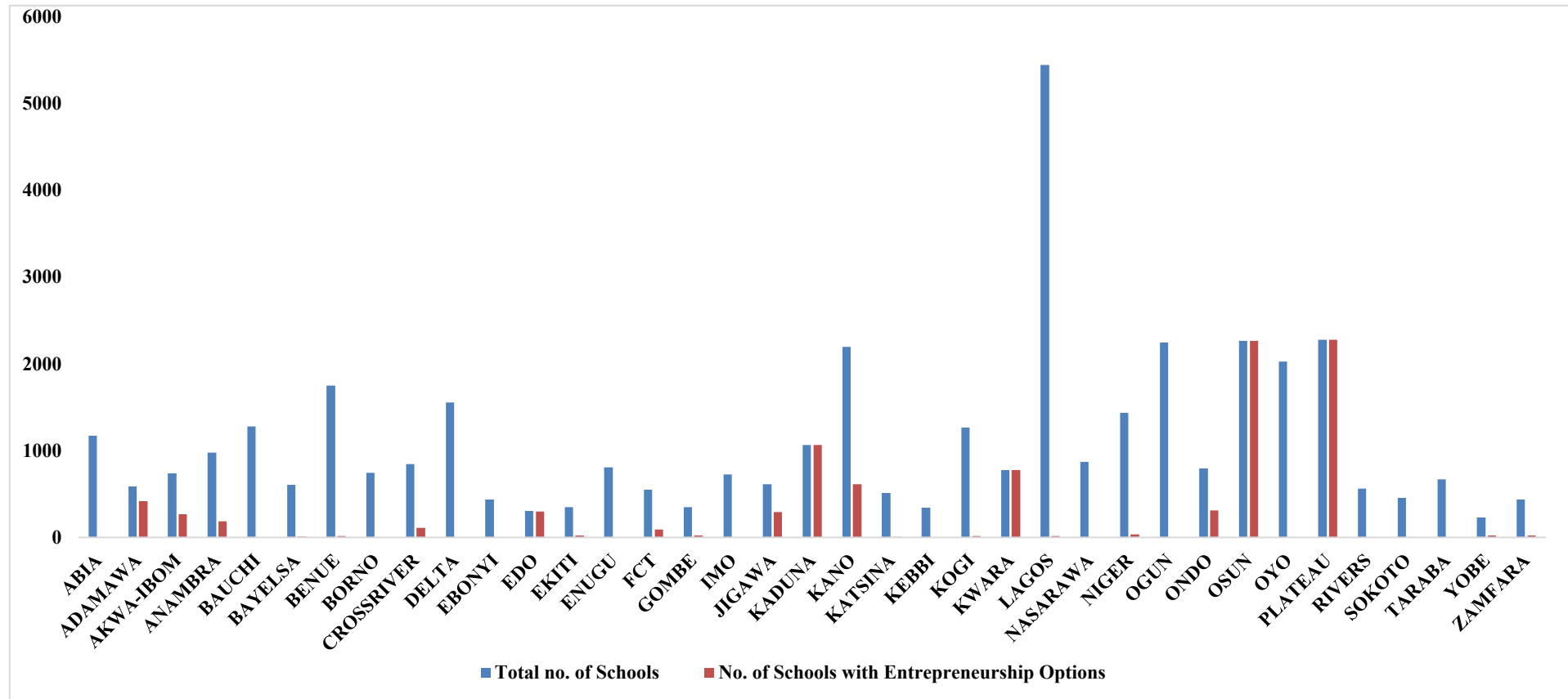

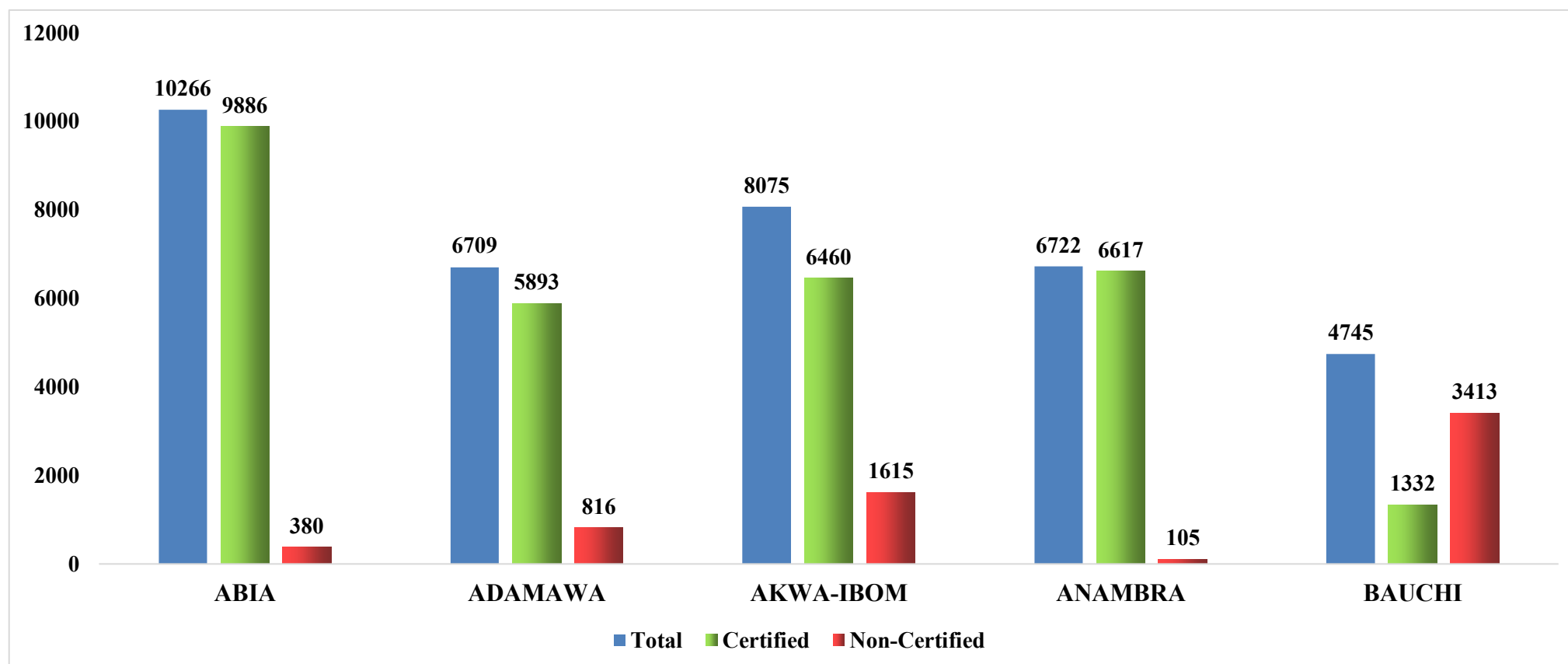
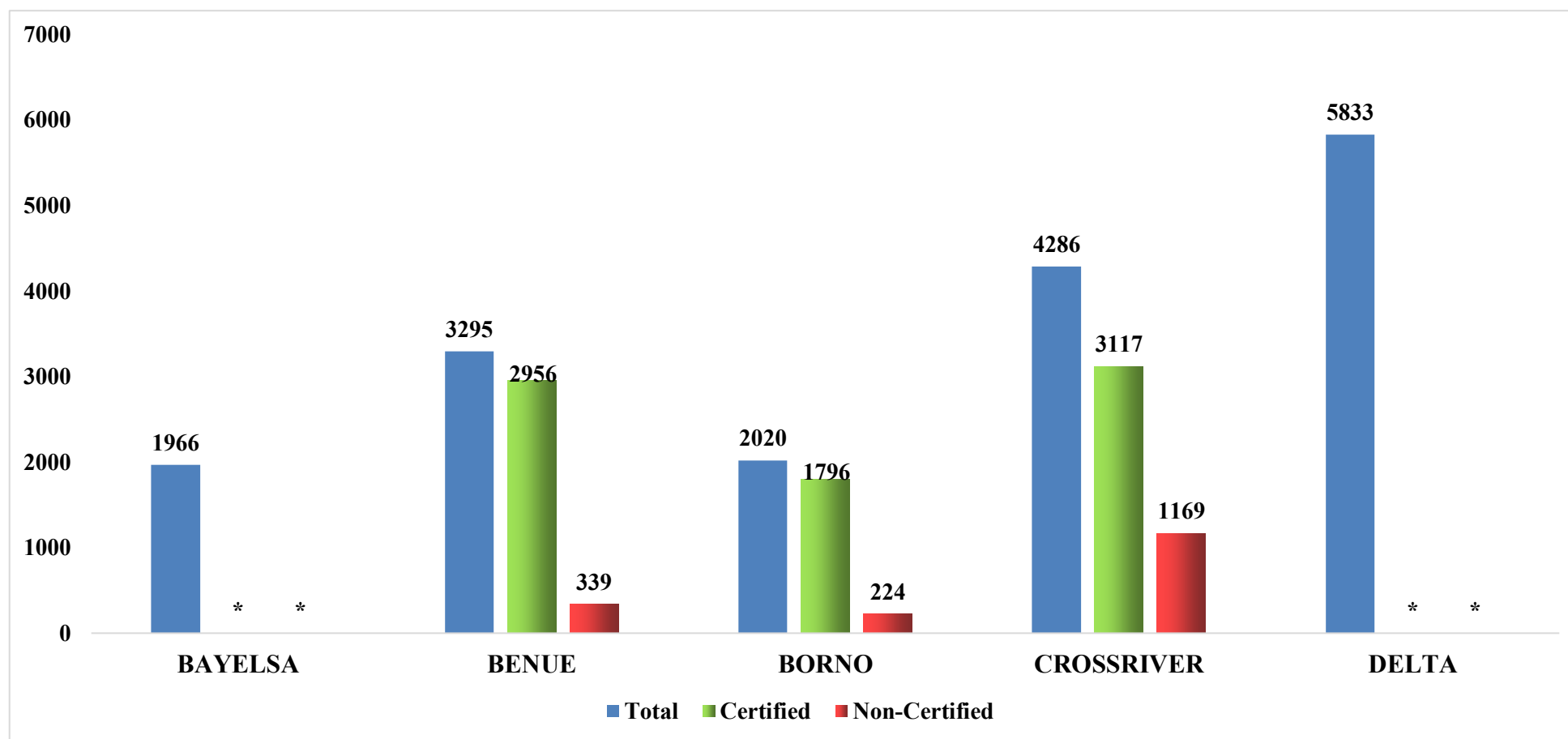
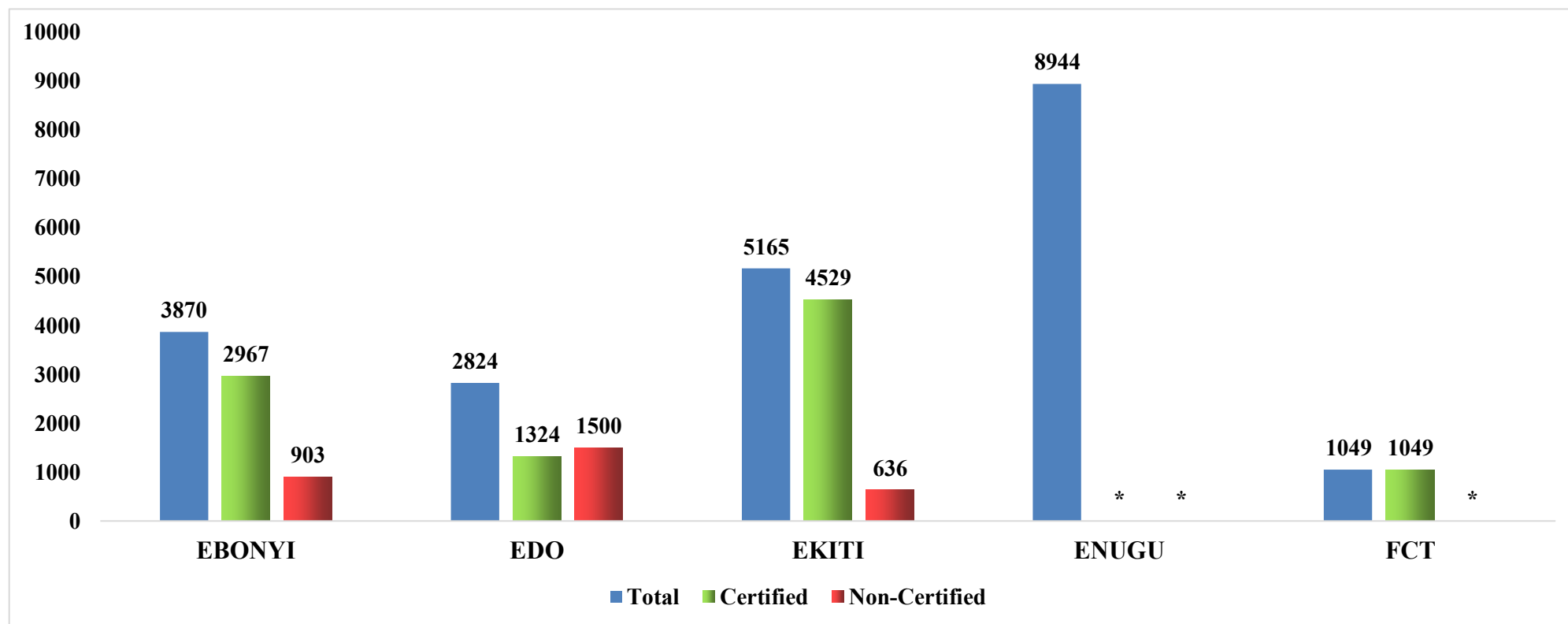


Figure 11: Total Number of TRCN Certified and Non-Certified Senior Secondary Schools Teachers in Bayelsa, Benue, Borno, Cross River and Delta.



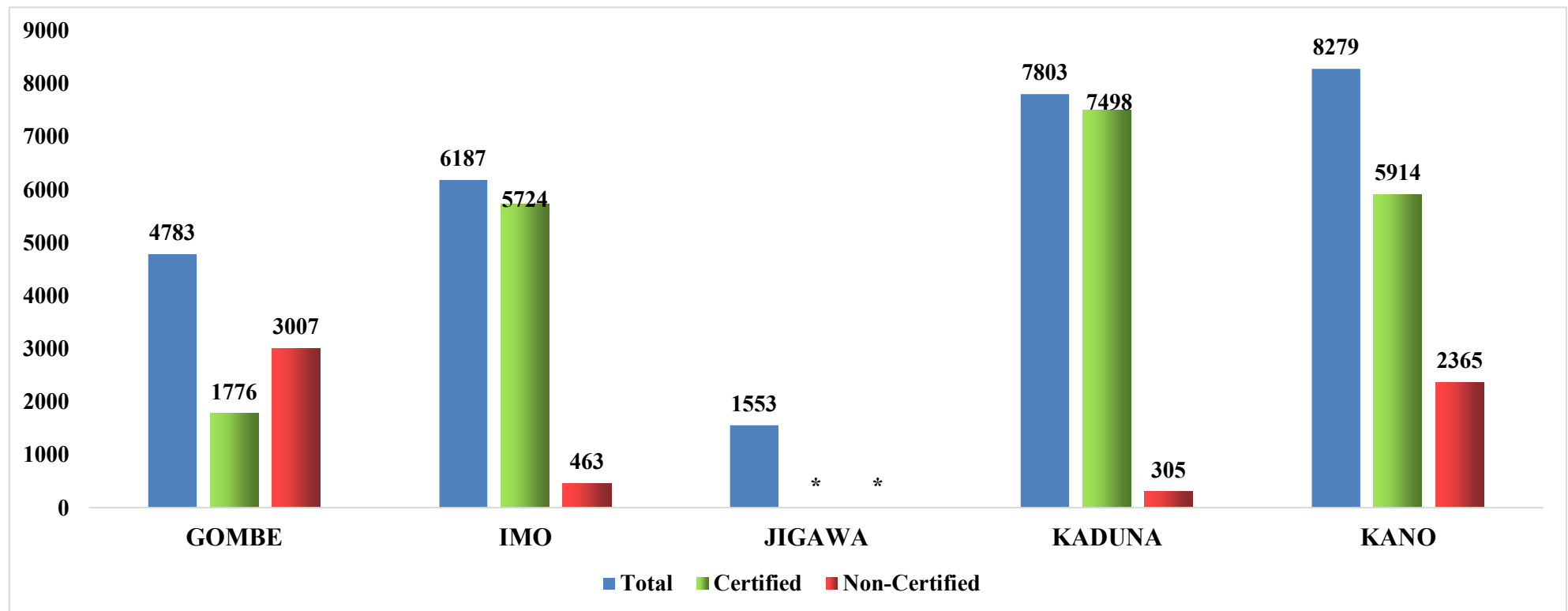

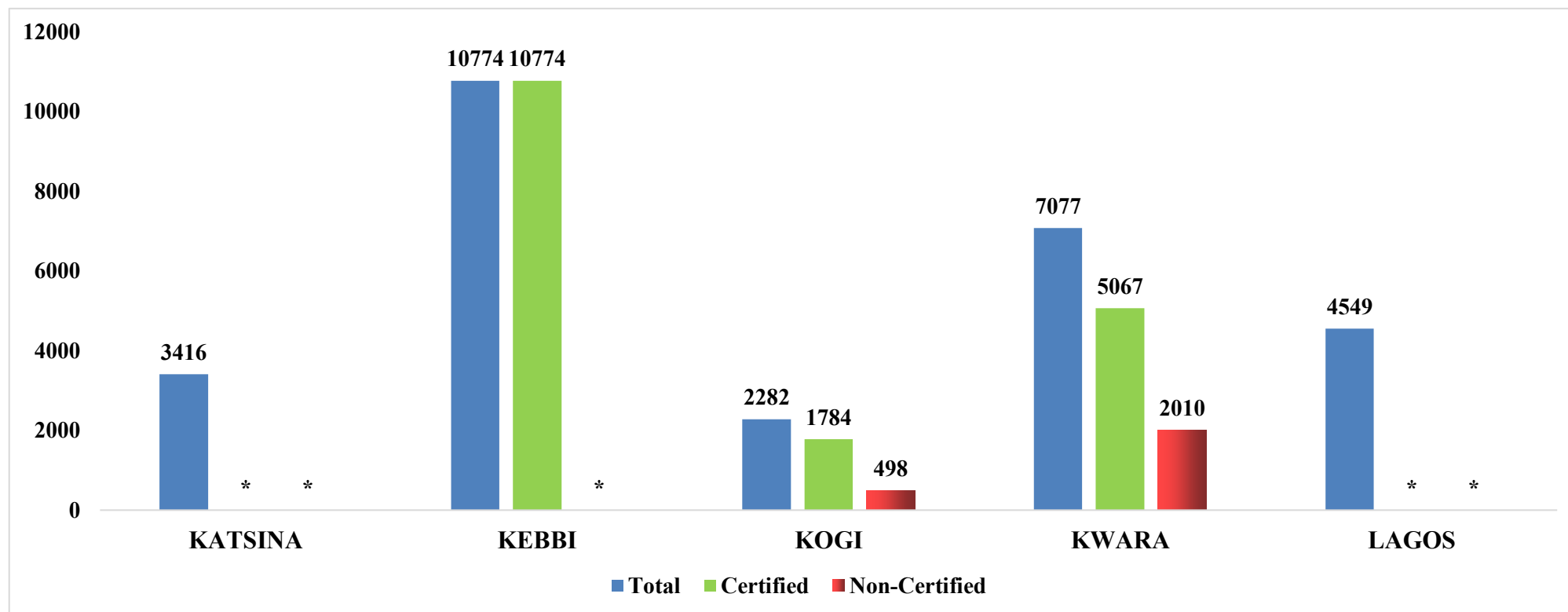

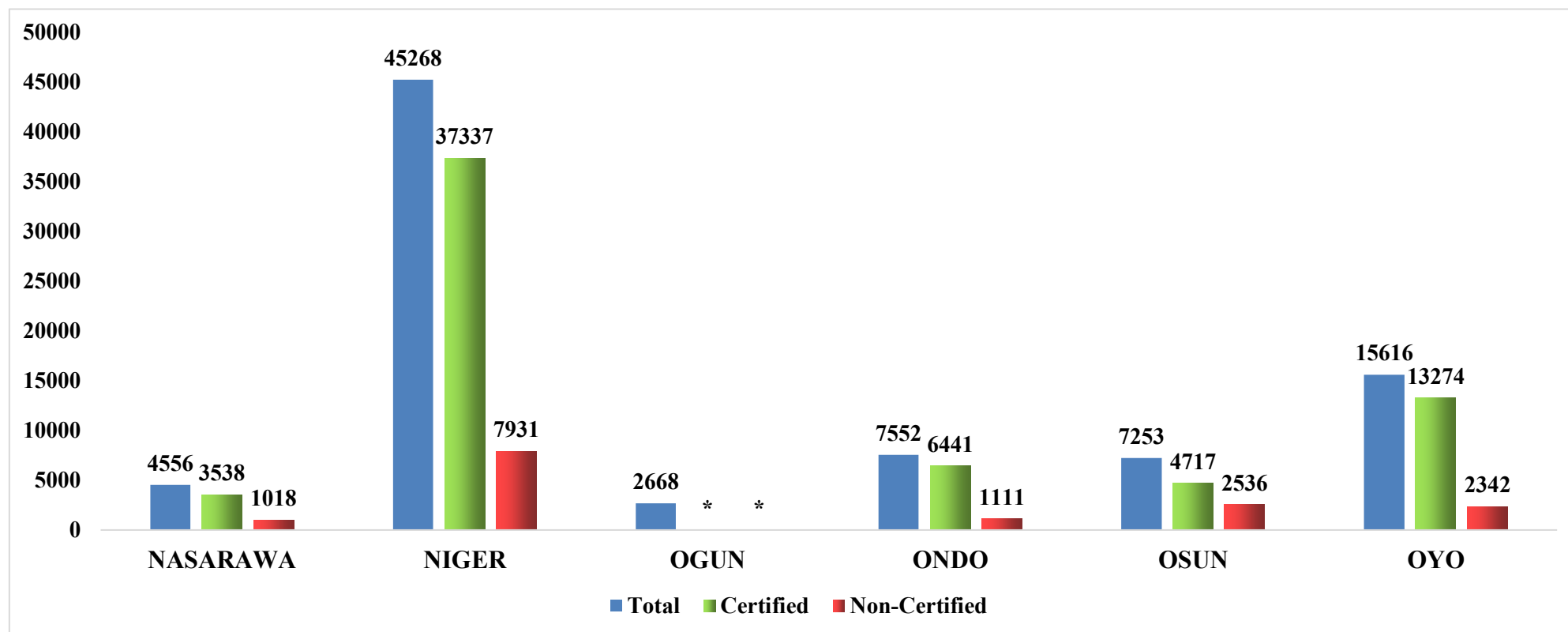

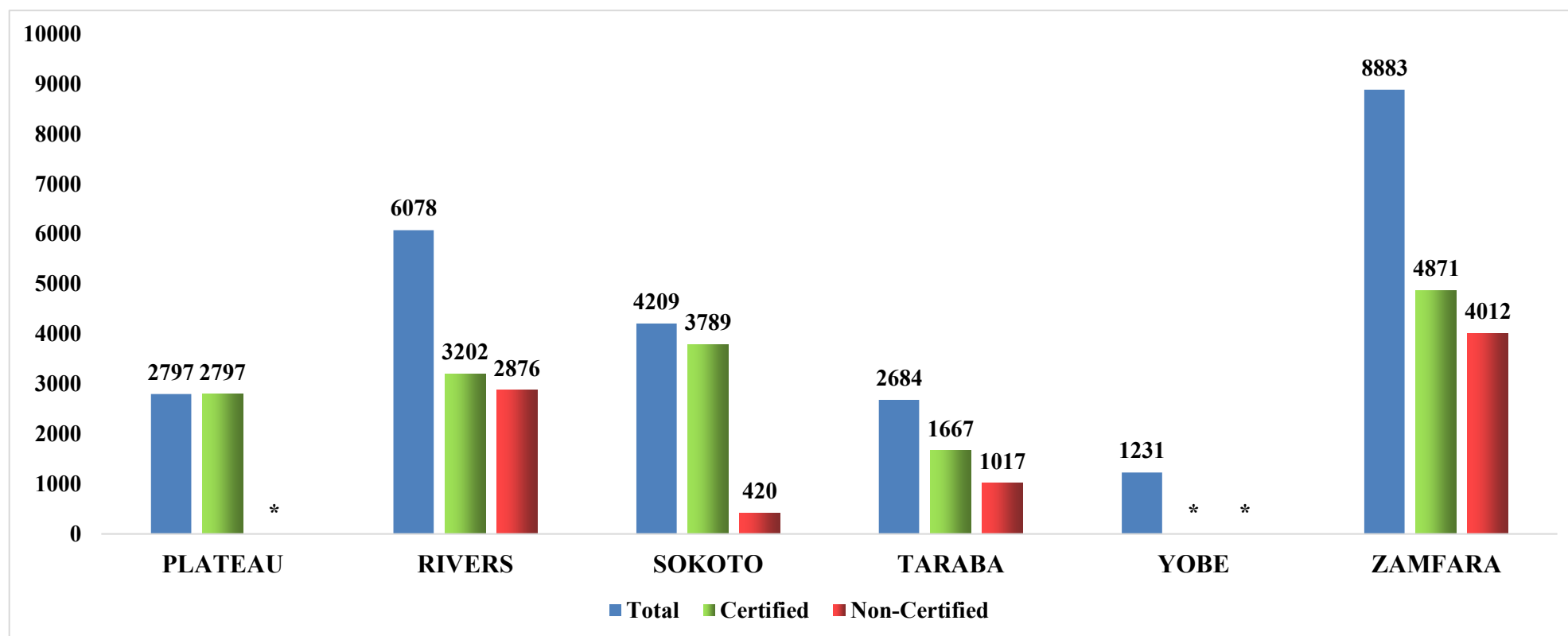

Figure 10 – 16 shows the total number of TRCN certified and non-certified senior secondary school teachers nationwide.

The charts reveals that there are Two Hundred and Forty-one Thousand, Two Hundred and Two Hundred and Sixty-seven (**241,267**) teachers in senior secondary schools nationwide (Excluding private senior secondary schools). One Hundred and Sixty-eight Thousand, Ninety-six (**168,096**) are TRCN certified while Forty-three Thousand and Eleven (**43,011**) teachers are not certified. However, some states did not indicate if their teachers are certified or not.

States with high percentages (at least 80%) of teachers with TRCN include Abia (96%), Adamawa (88%), Akwa-Ibom (80%), Anambra (98%), Benue (90%), Borno (89%), Ekiti (88%), FCT (100%), Imo (93%), Kaduna (96%), Kebbi (100%), Niger (82%), Ondo (85%), Oyo (85%), Plateau (100%) and Sokoto (90%).

Bauchi (72%), Edo (53%) and Gombe (63%) States have higher percentages of teachers who are not certified compared with those who are certified.

Figure 17: Number of English Language Teachers in Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 States and FCT

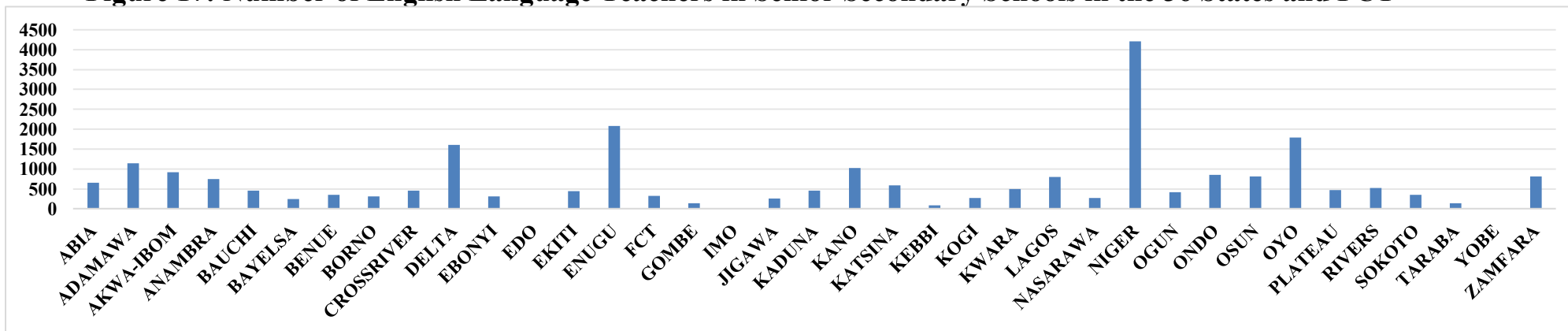
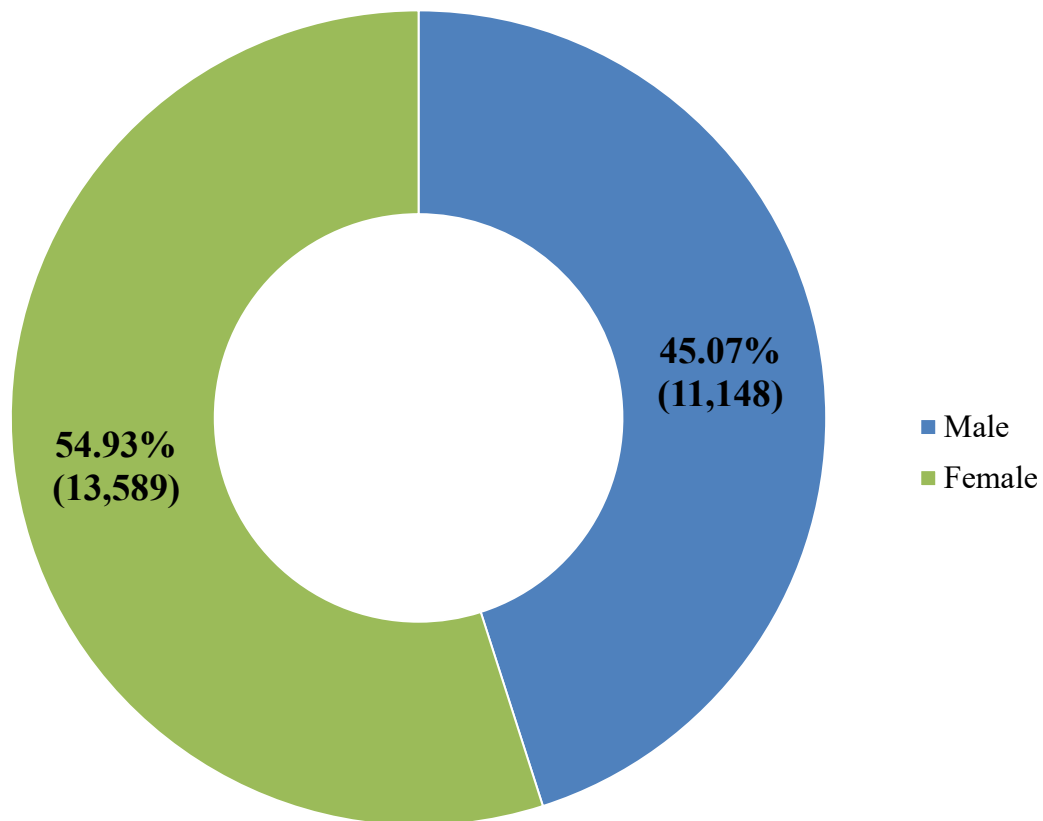


Figure 18: Total Number of English Language Teachers in the Senior Secondary Schools by Gender and Percentage.

Figure 19: Number of Mathematics Teachers in Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 States and FCT

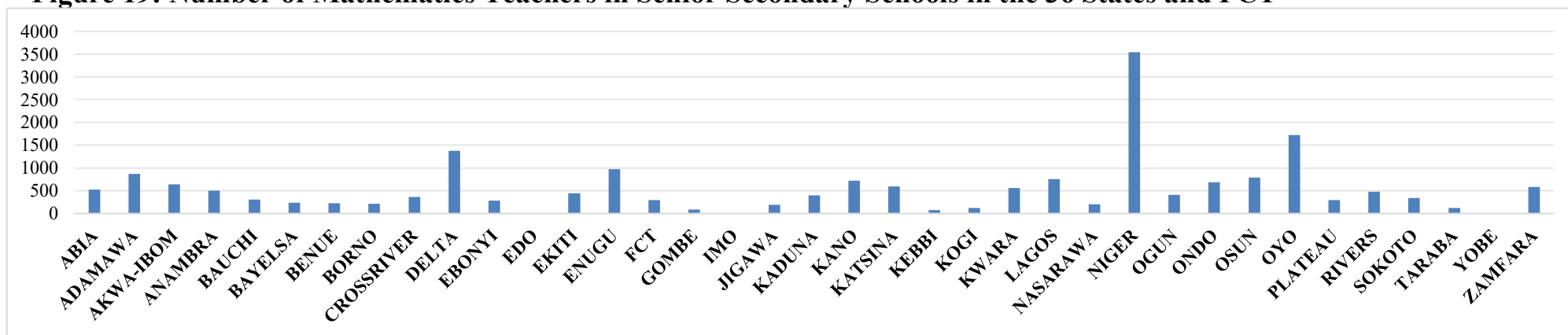
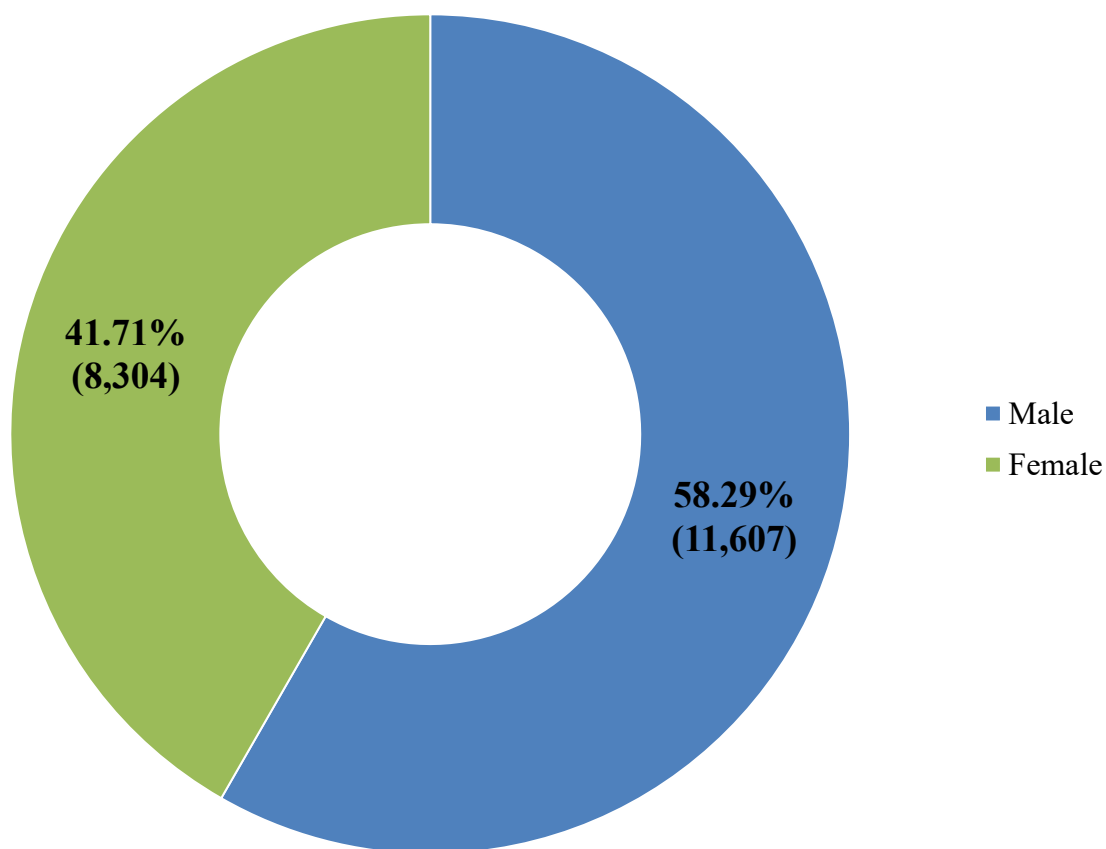


Figure 20: Total Number of Mathematics Teachers in Senior Secondary schools by Gender and Percentage.

Figure 21: Number of Civic Education Teachers in Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 States and FCT

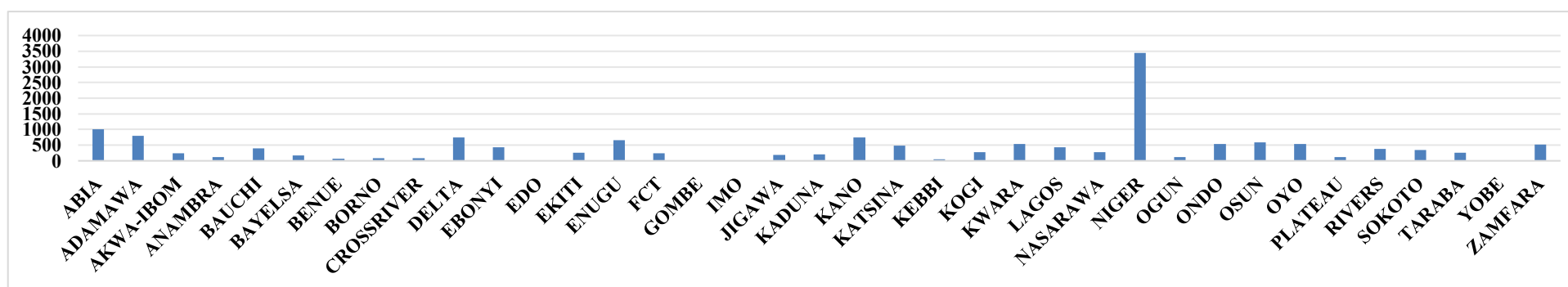
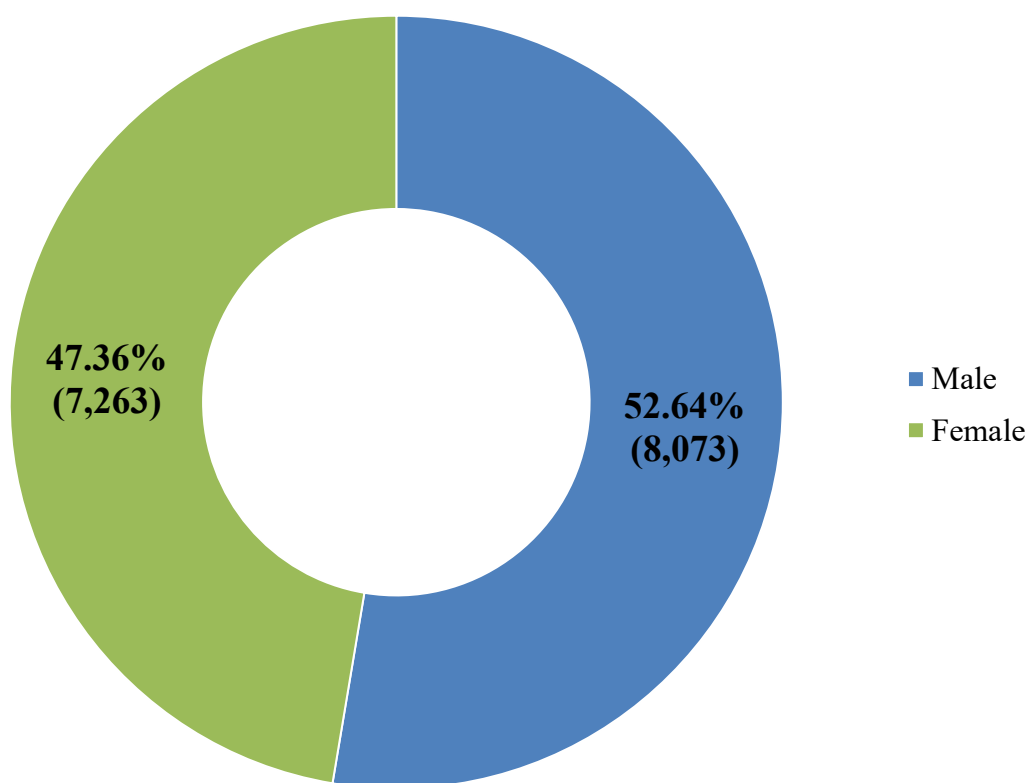


Figure 22: Total Number of Civic Education Teachers in Senior Secondary schools by Gender and Percentage.

Figure 23: Number of Physics Teachers in Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 States and FCT

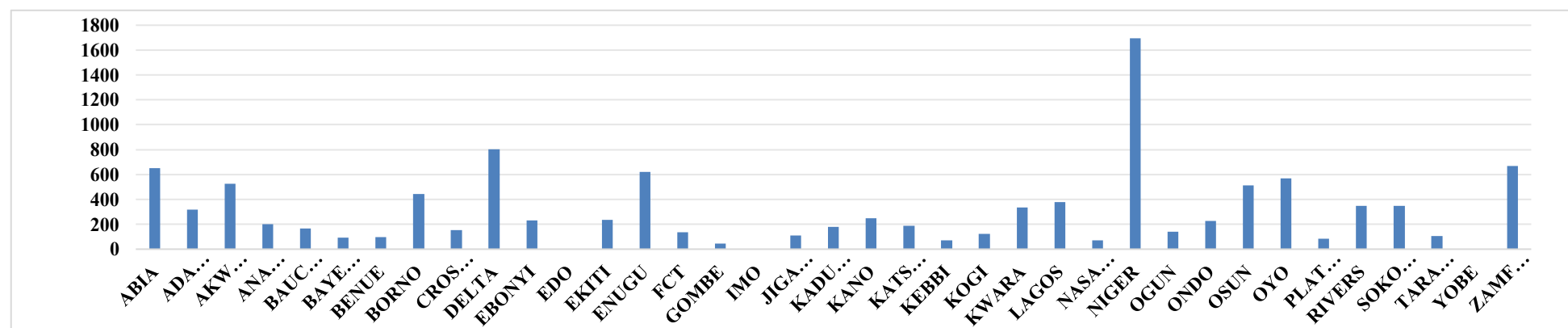
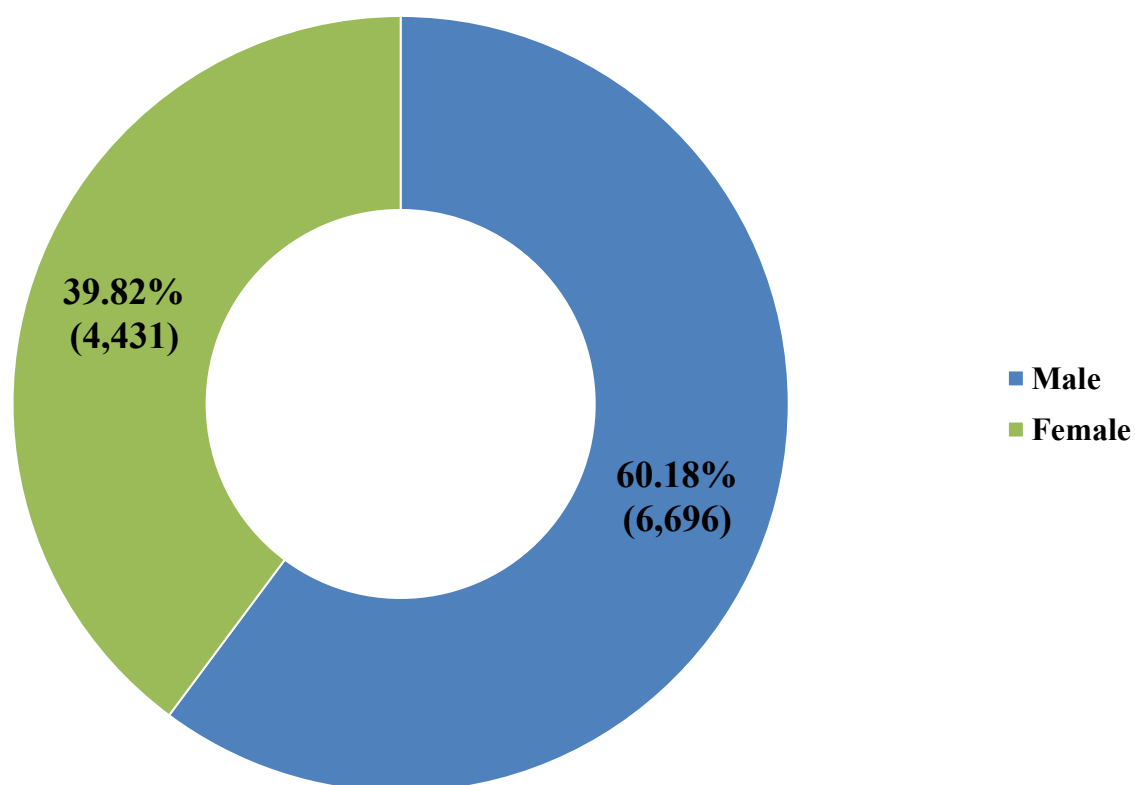


Figure 24: Total Number of Physics Teachers in the Senior Secondary Schools by Gender and Percentage.

Figure 25: Number of Biology Teachers in Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 States and FCT

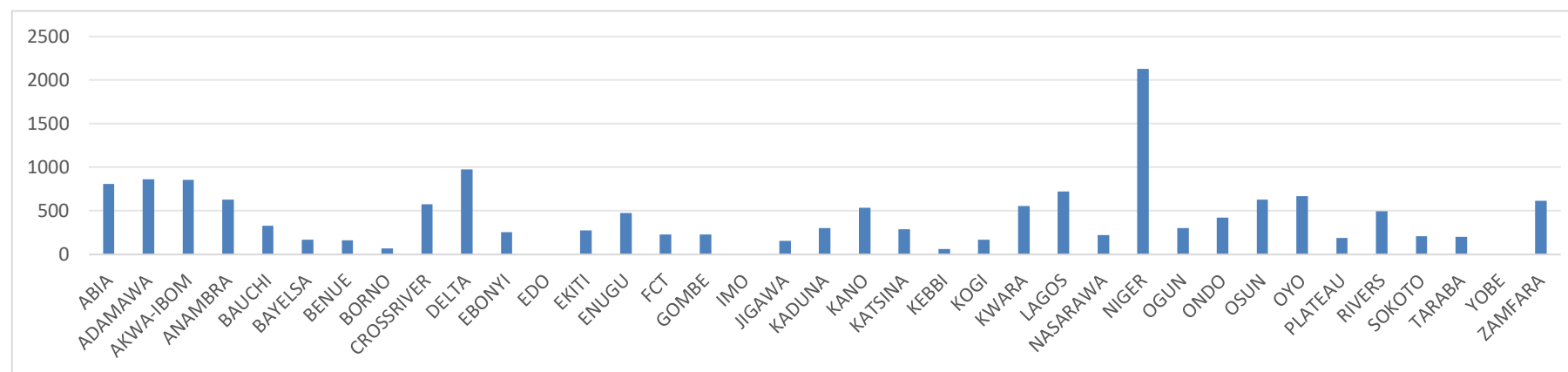
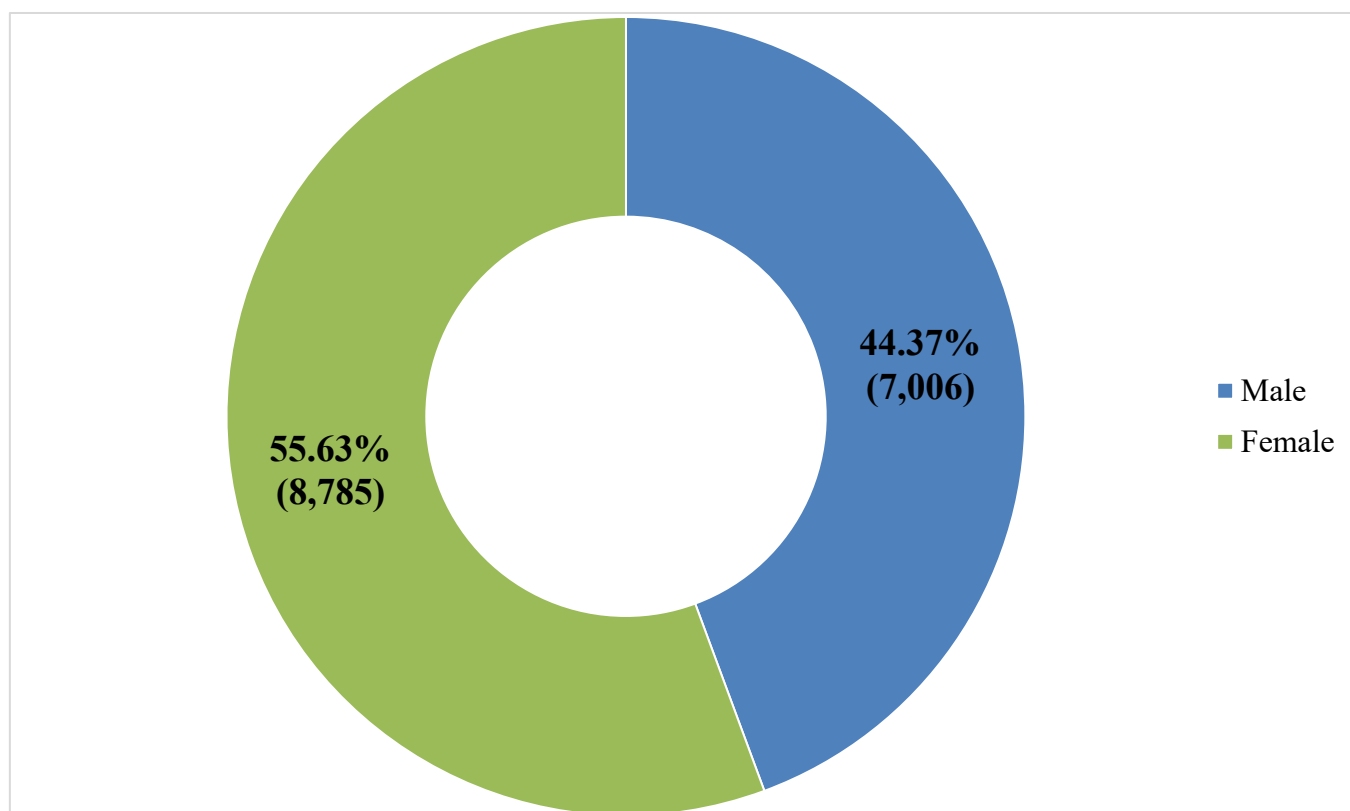


Figure 26: Total Number of Biology Teachers in the Senior Secondary Schools by Gender and Percentage.

Figure 27: Number of Chemistry Teachers in Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 States and FCT

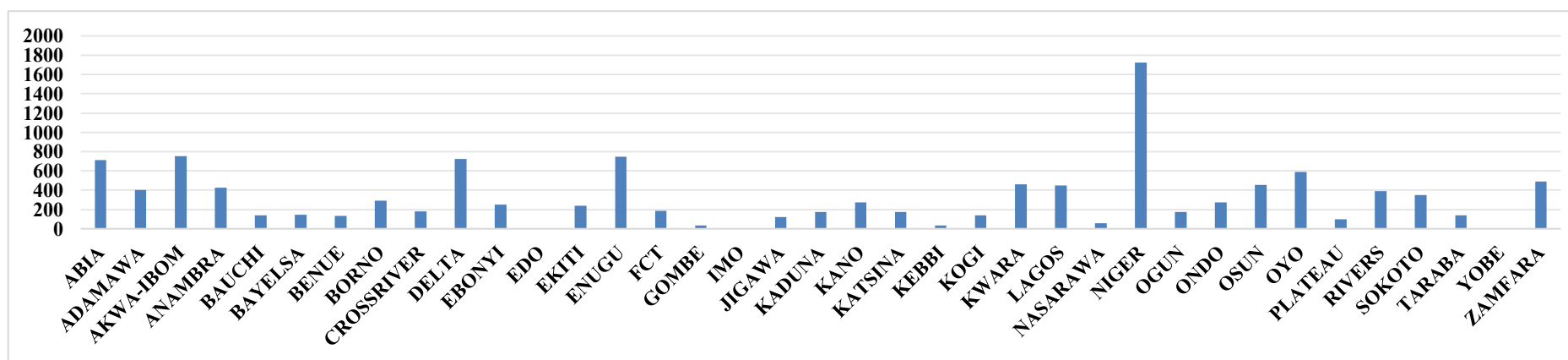
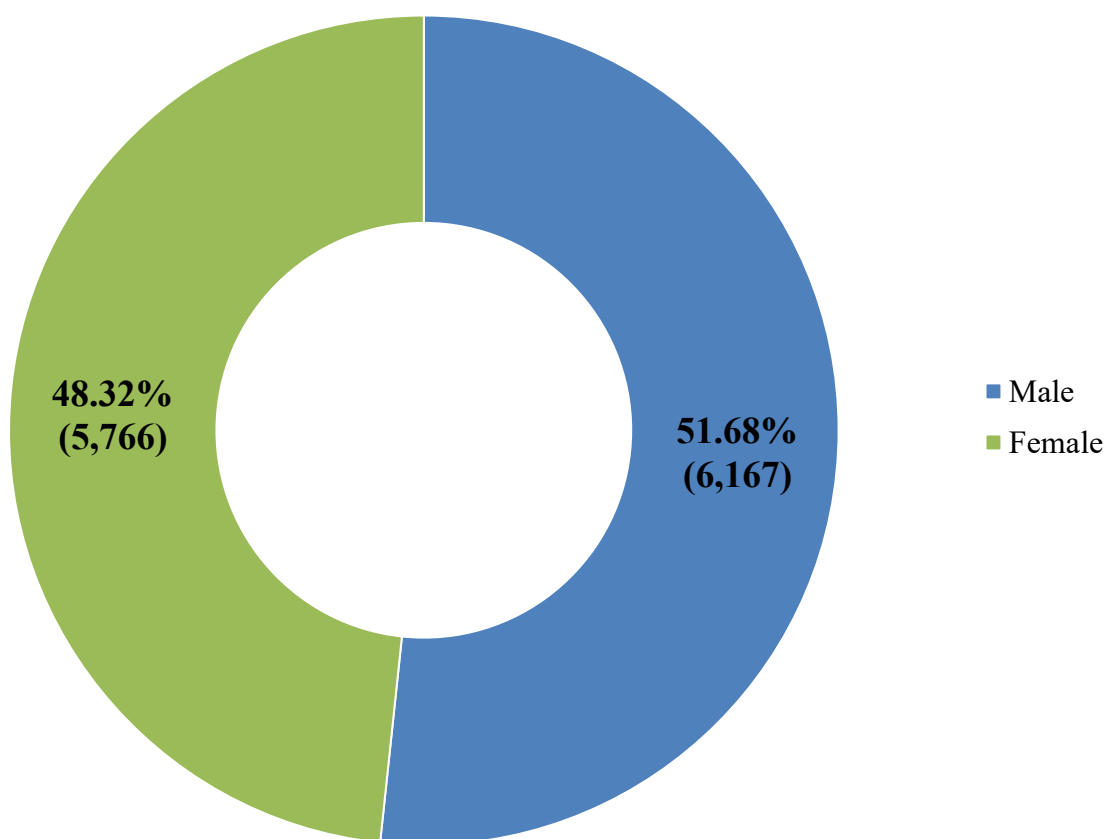


Figure 28: Total Number of Chemistry Teachers in the Senior Secondary Schools by Gender and Percentage.

Figure 29: Number of Agricultural science Teachers in Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 States and FCT

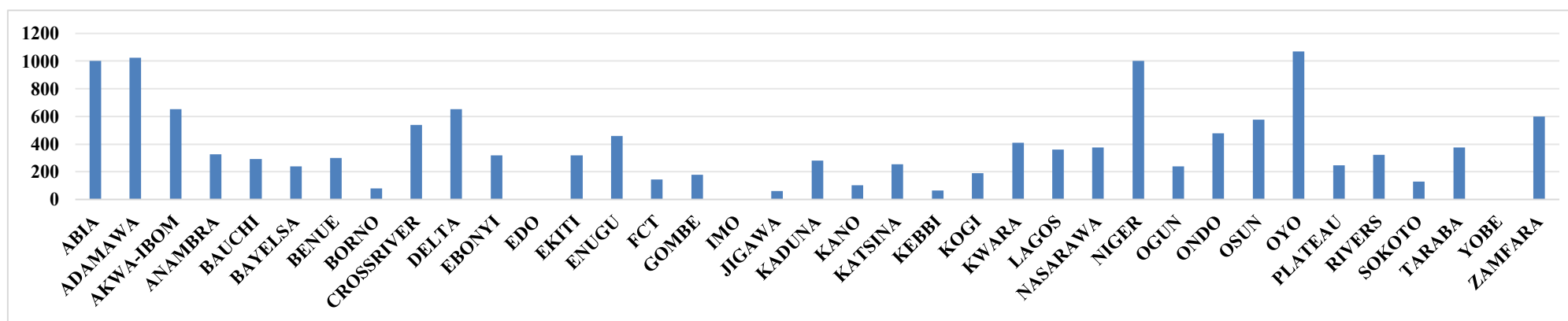
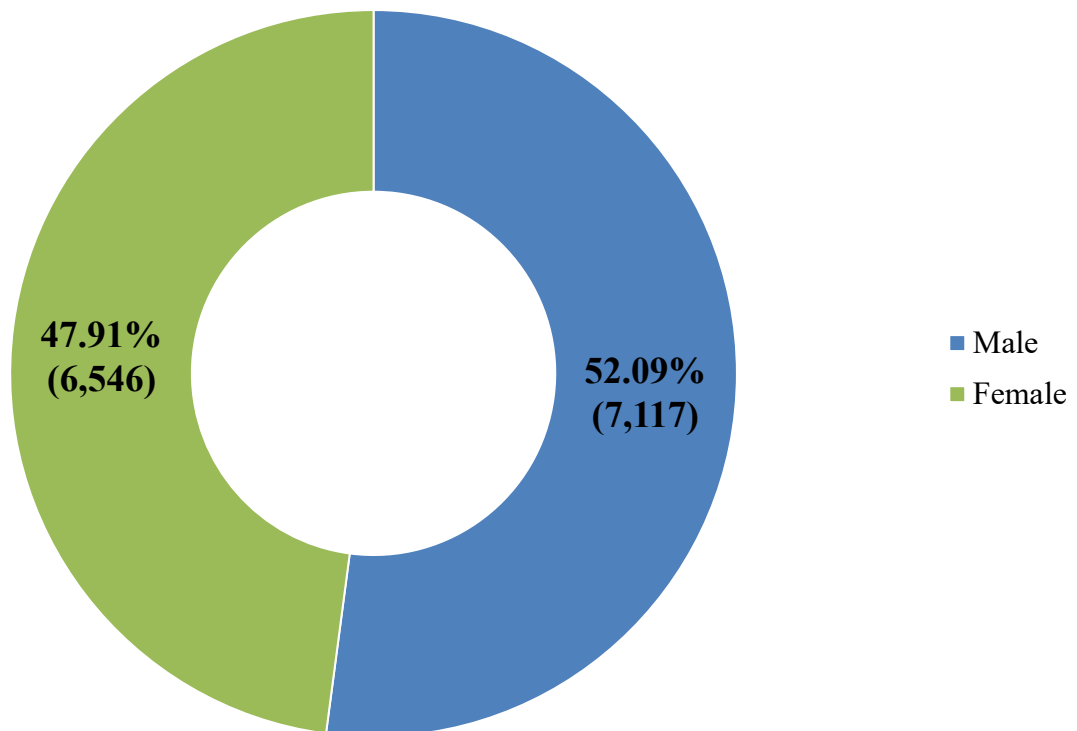


Figure 30: Total Number of Agricultural science Teachers in the Senior Secondary Schools by Gender and Percentage.

Figure 31: Number of Economics in Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 States and FCT

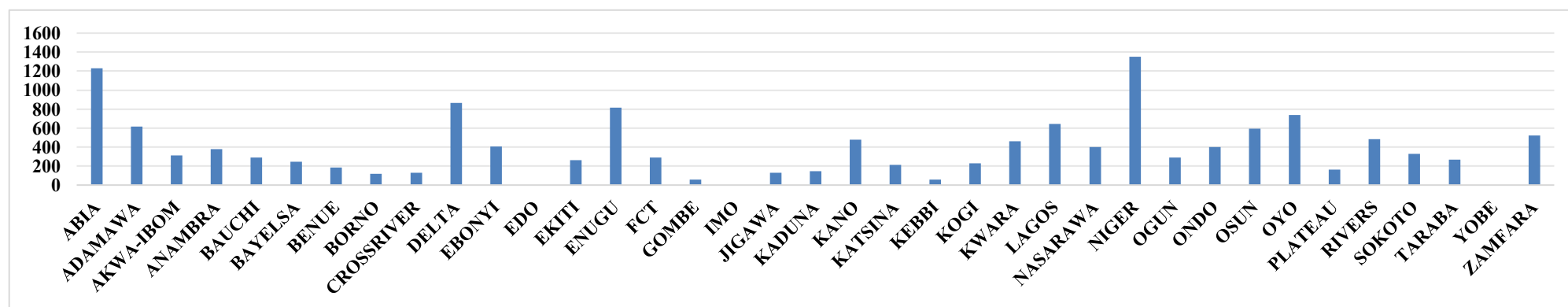
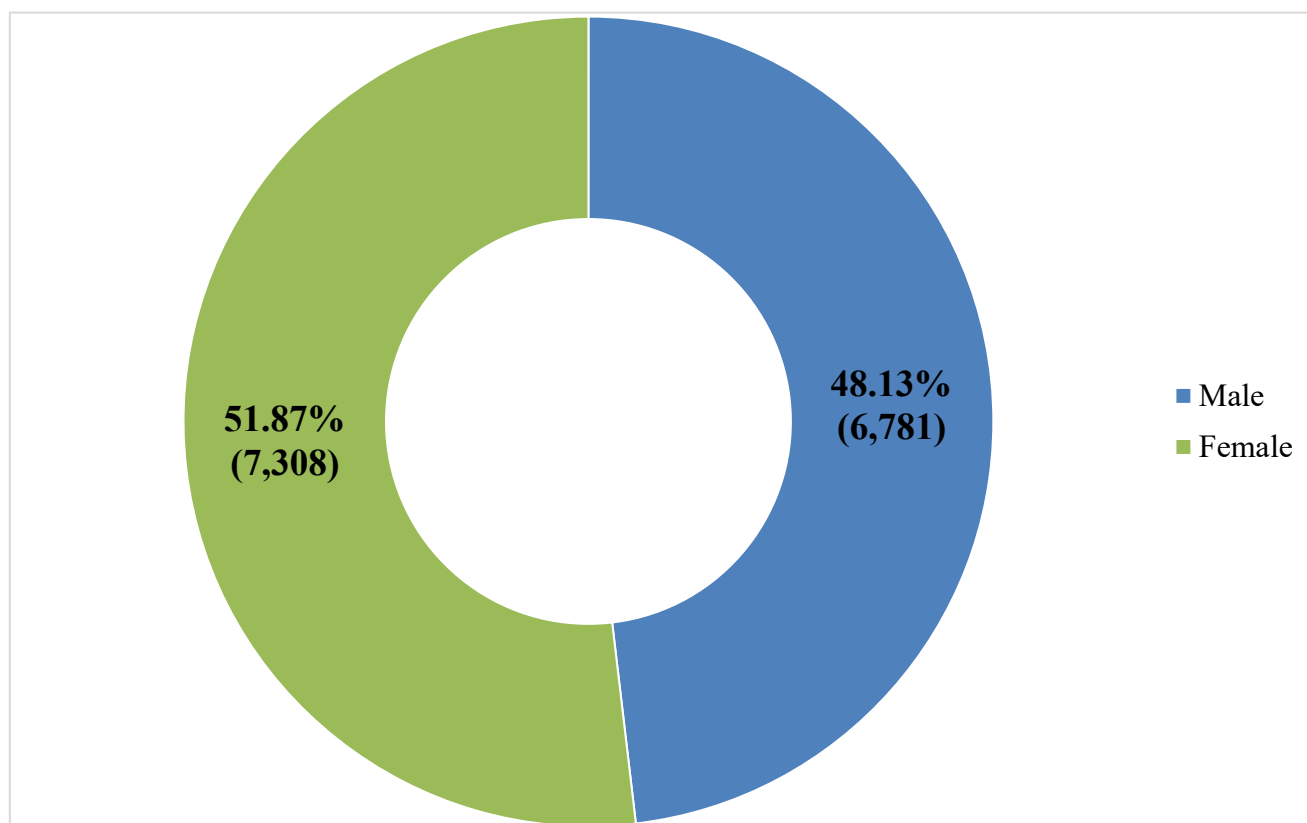


Figure 32: Total Number of Economics Teachers in the Senior Secondary Schools by Gender and Percentage.

Figure 33: Number of Government Teachers in Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 States and FCT

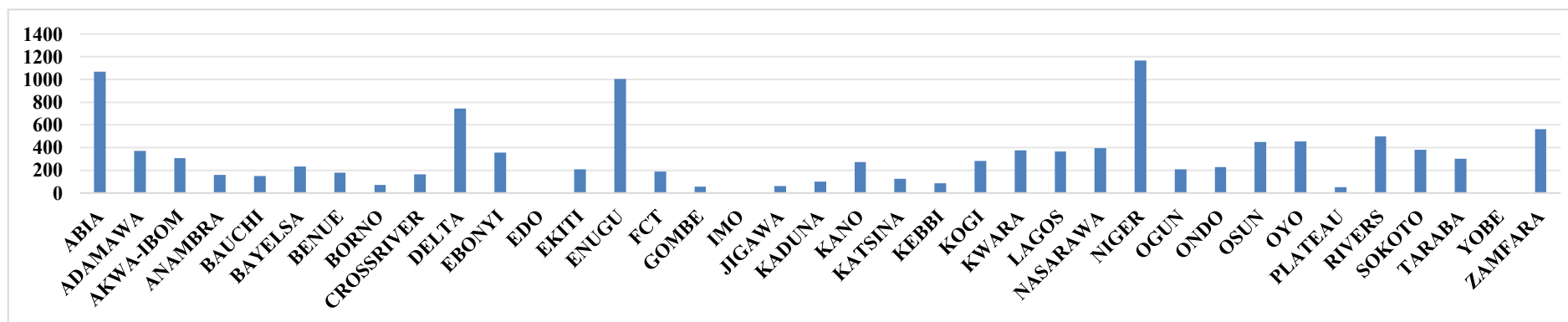
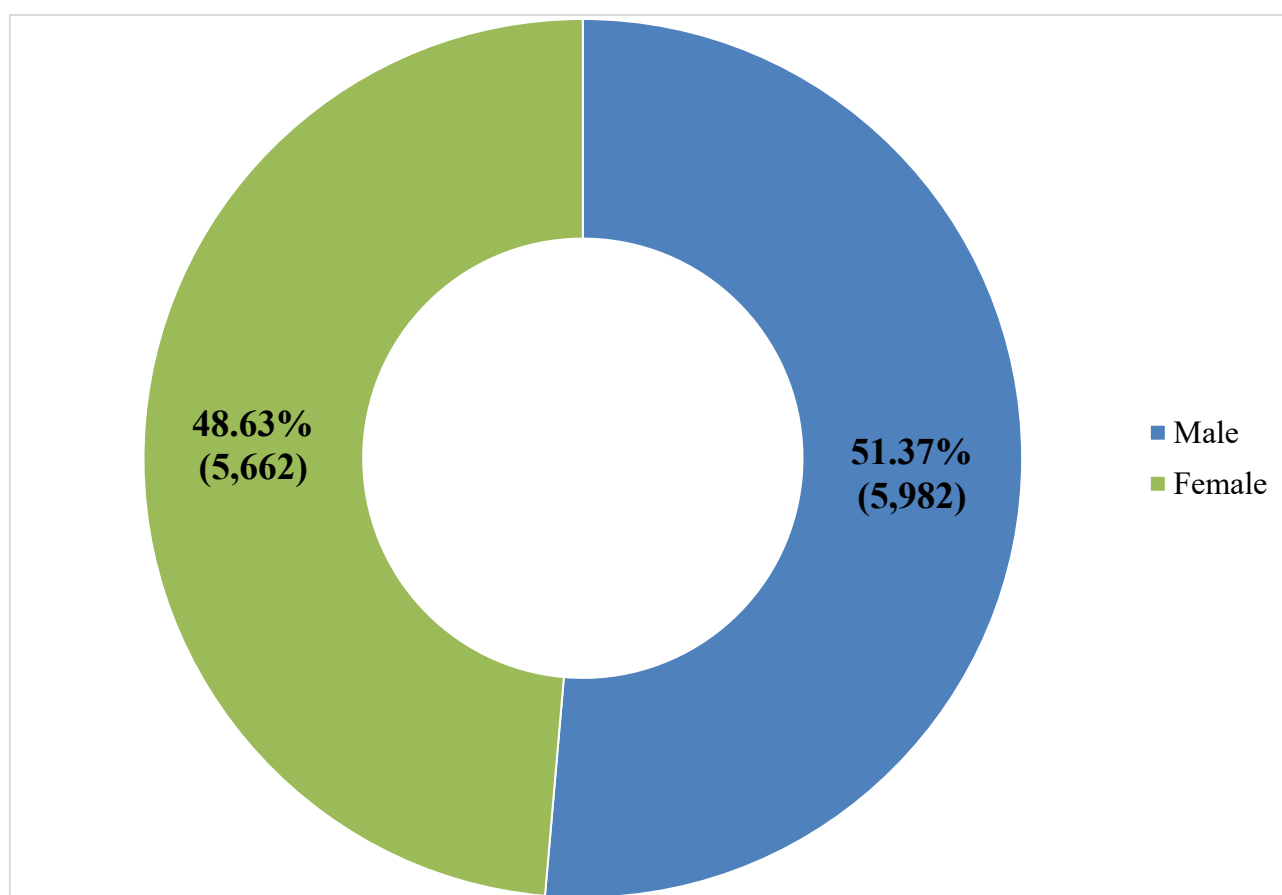


Figure 34: Total Number of Government Teachers in the Senior Secondary Schools by Gender and Percentage.

Figure 35: Number of Geography Teachers in Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 States and FCT

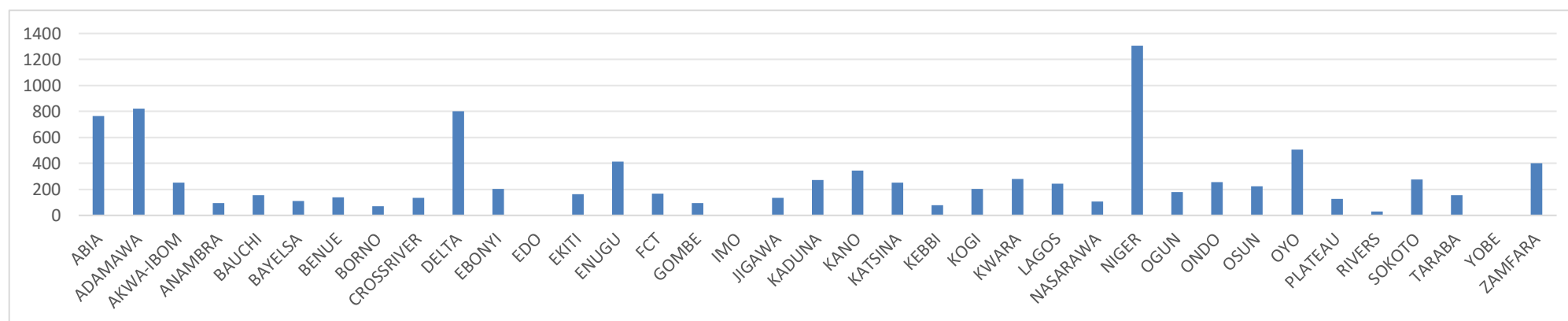
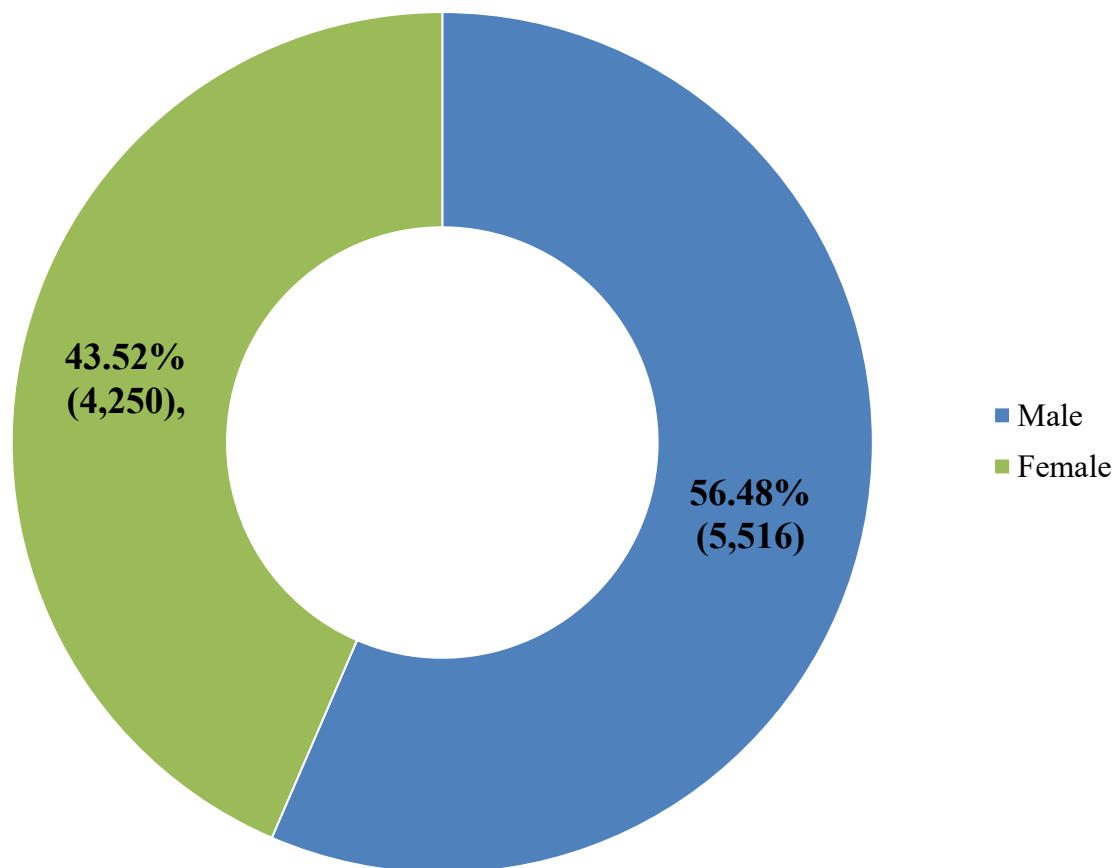


Figure 36: Total Number of Geography Teachers in the Senior Secondary Schools by Gender and Percentage.

Figure 37: Number of Computer Science Teachers in Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 States and FCT

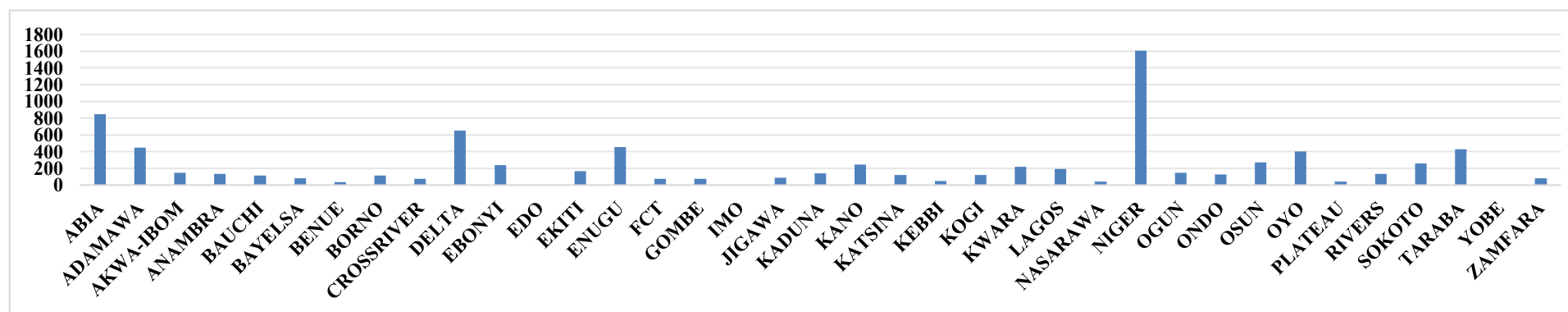
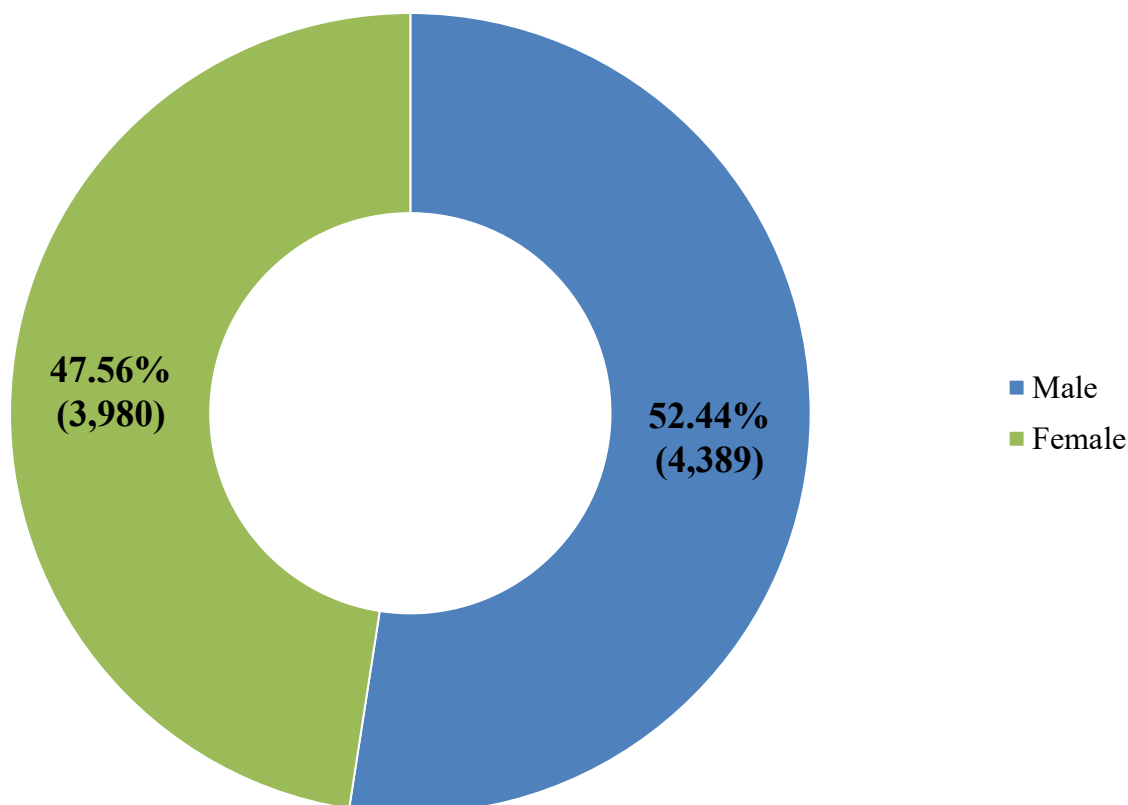


Figure 38: Total Number of Computer Science Teachers in the Senior Secondary Schools by Gender and Percentage.

Figure 39: Number of Technical ad Vocational Science Teachers in Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 States and FCT

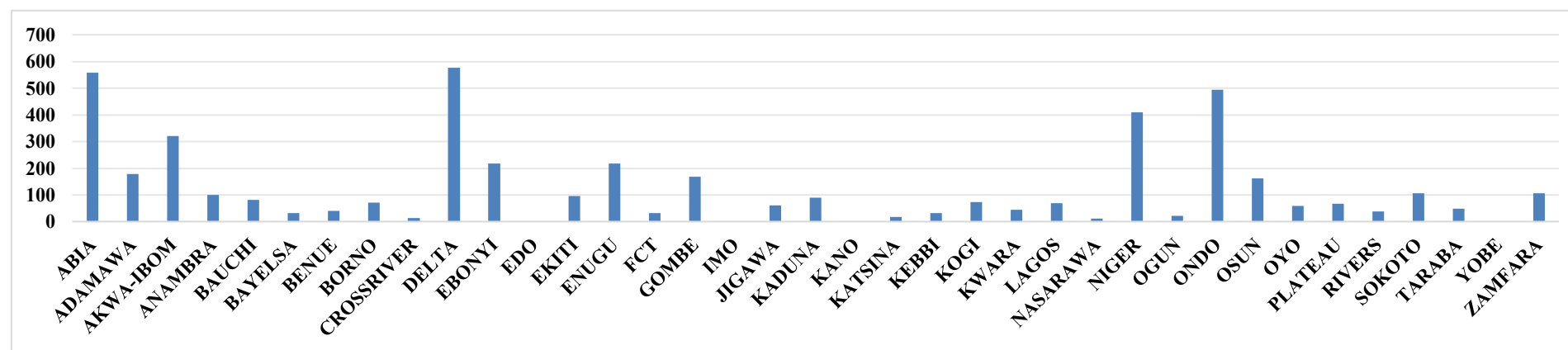
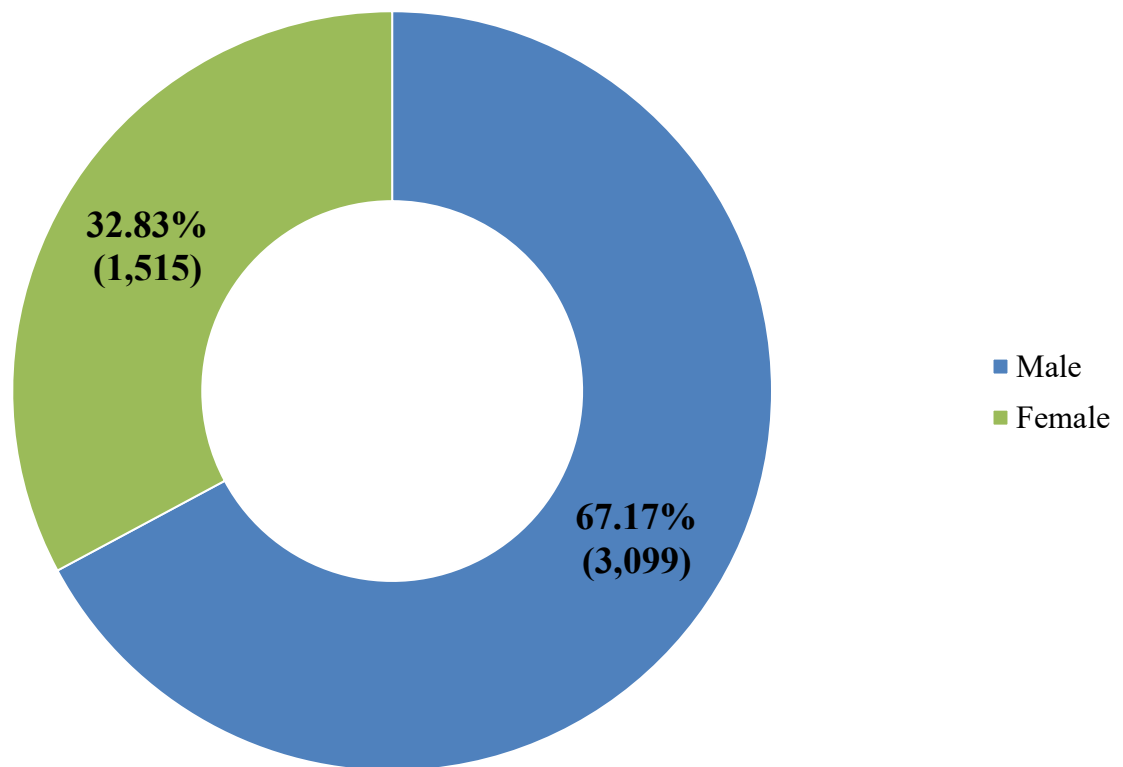


Figure 40: Total Number of Technical and Vocational Science Teachers in the Senior Secondary Schools by Gender and Percentage.

Figure 41: Number of Trade and Entrepreneurship Teachers in Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 States and FCT

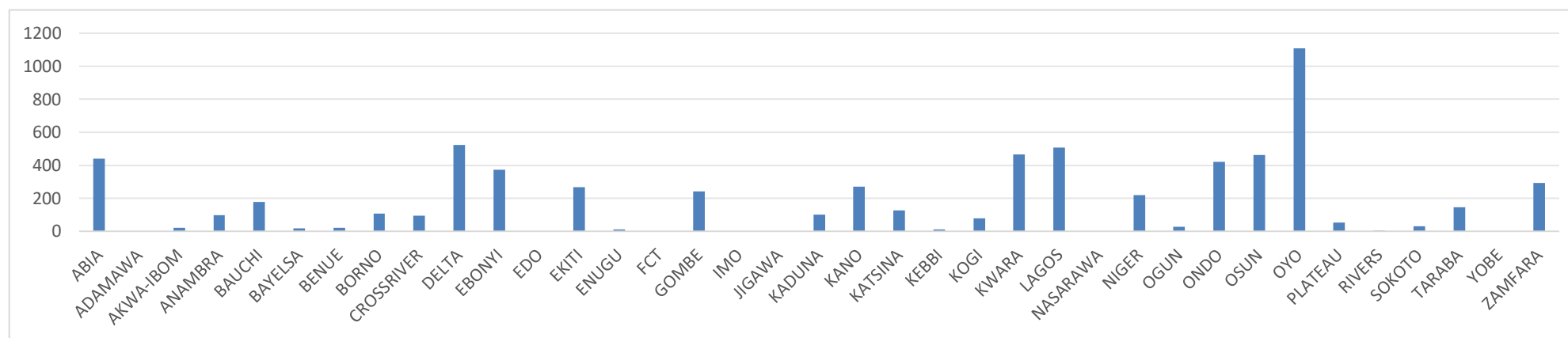
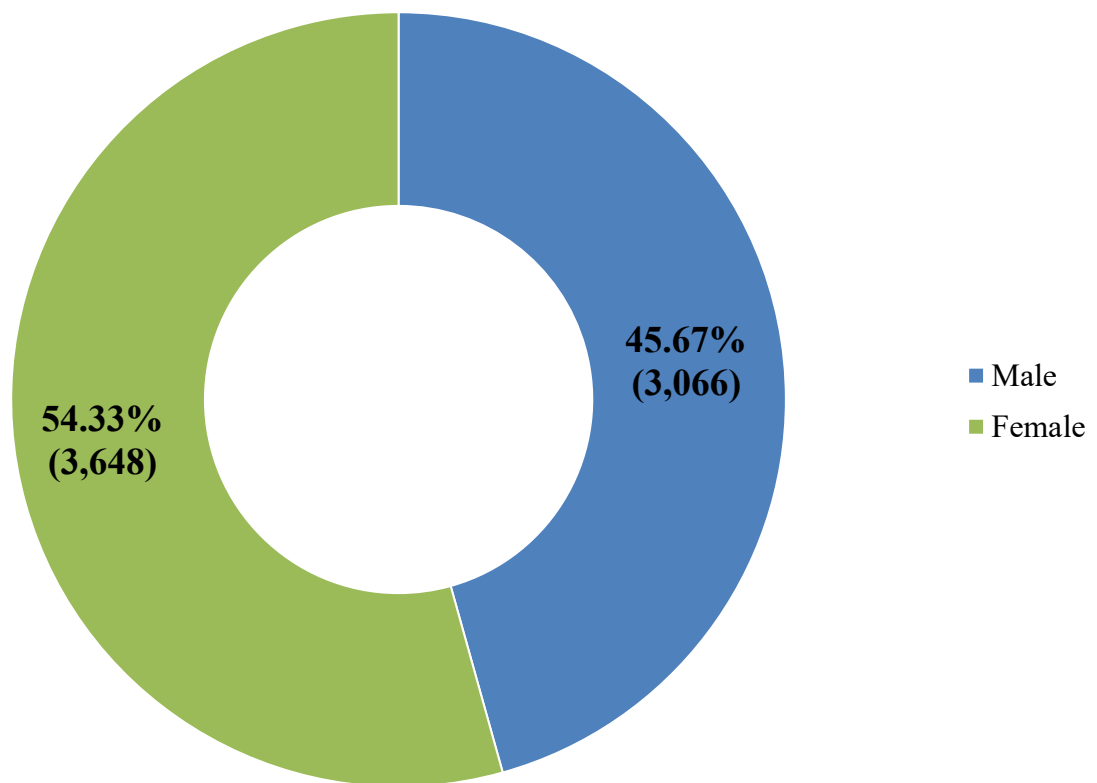


Figure 42: Total Number of Trade and Entrepreneurship Teachers in the Senior Secondary Schools by Gender and Percentage.



There are Six Thousand, Seven Hundred and Fourteen (**6,714**) Trade and Entrepreneurship Teachers in the Senior Secondary Schools in the 36 States and FCT as shown in table 20 and figure 41. It also shows that Oyo State has the highest number of English Language Teachers (**1,109**). Figure 42 shows the total number of Trade and Entrepreneurship Teachers in the Senior Secondary School by gender and percentage nationwide. It shows that there are Three Thousand and Sixty-six (**3,066**) male teachers and Three Thousand, Six Hundred and Forty-eight (**3,648**) female teachers at **45.67%** and **54.33%** respectively. Figure 43: Laboratories, Classrooms, Libraries and Workshops in Senior Secondary Schools across the 36 States and FCT.

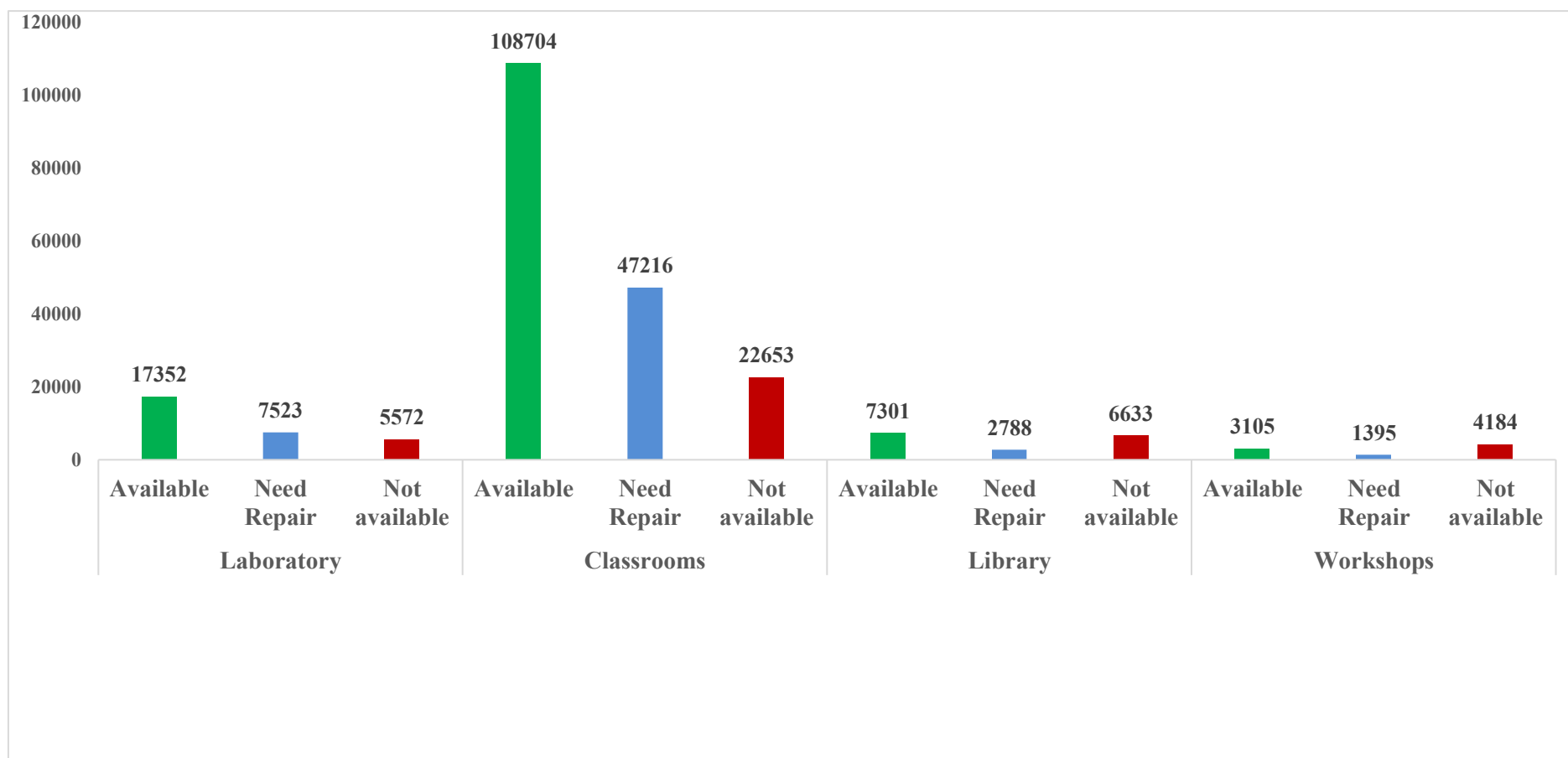

The Chart reveals that Seventeen Thousand, Three Hundred and Fifty-two (**17,352**) laboratories are available, Seven Thousand, Five Hundred and Twenty-three (**7,523**) need repairs and Five Thousand, Five Hundred and Seventy-two (**5,572**) need to be provided.

It also revealed that One Hundred and Eight Thousand, Seven Hundred and Four (**108,704**) classrooms are available, Forty-seven Thousand, Two Hundred and Sixteen (**47,216**) need repairs and Twenty-two Thousand, Six Hundred and Fifty-three (**22,653**) need to be provided.

Seven Thousand, Three Hundred and One (**7,301**) libraries are available, Two Thousand, Seven Hundred and Eighty-eight (**2,788**) need repairs and Six Thousand, Six Hundred and Thirty-three (**6,633**) need to be provided.
